SUMMARY OF MEETINGS Friday, 21 September 2012

Sessional Committee I – First plenary meeting

Item 5 UNCTAD's contribution to the implementation of the Istanbul Programme of Action for LDCs: First progress report

Mr. Mohamed Elmurtada Mubarak Ismail (Sudan) was elected Vice-Chair-cum-Rapporteur. Mr. Petko Draganov, Deputy Secretary-General of UNCTAD, made an opening statement on item 5. This was followed by an introductory statement by Mr. Taffere Tesfachew, Director, Division for Africa, Least Developed Countries and Special Programmes, UNCTAD.

General statements

Statements were made by representatives of the following member States or groups of States: Indonesia (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China); Nepal (on behalf of the least developed countries); Mauritius (on behalf of the African Group); Paraguay (on behalf of the Group of Latin American and Caribbean Countries); the Islamic Republic of Iran (on behalf of the Asian Group); the European Union; Paraguay (on behalf of the landlocked developing countries); Angola; Turkey; China and Bangladesh. In addition, a statement was made by the representative of the nongovernmental organization LDC Watch.

The general statements were followed by presentations by two panellists: H.E. Mr. Leopold Ismael Samba, Permanent Representative of the Central African Republic and H.E. Mr. Shanker Das Bairagi, Permanent Representative of Nepal.

The Chair made closing remarks.

Follow-up to the Joint Inspection Unit report and the agreed conclusions of the twenty-sixth special session of the Trade and Development Board on 6 July 2012

Mr. Petko Draganov, the Deputy Secretary-General of UNCTAD, presented the Work plan for enhancing the management and administration of UNCTAD, contained in document TD/B/59/CRP.2.

Statements were made by representatives of the following member States or groups of States: Indonesia (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China); the Islamic Republic of Iran (on behalf of the Asian Group); the European Union; Switzerland; Japan; the United States of America; China; Turkey and Mexico.

The President proposed that discussion on the agenda item continue after further informal consultations on the subject.
