Proposals received for officers of the Bureau

Note by the secretariat

1. At the second session of the plenary meeting to determine modalities and institutional arrangements for an intergovernmental science-policy platform on biodiversity and ecosystem services, held in Panama City from 16 to 21 April 2012, it was agreed that members of the Platform were to be invited to propose their candidates for the Bureau for nomination by regions and election by the Plenary (see UNEP/IPBES.MI/2/9, annex I, appendix II, rule 16).
2. As stipulated in rule 16 of the rules of procedure for the Plenary of the Platform, the Bureau of the Plenary will consist of the Chair, four Vice-Chairs and five other officers, to be elected from among the members of the Platform. Each of the five United Nations regions is to be represented by two officers in the Bureau, taking into account the principle of geographical representation. Further details on the nomination and selection of the officers of the Bureau are provided in the rules of procedure for the Plenary of the Platform (UNEP/IPBES.MI/2/9, annex I, appendix II) and in the guidance document on the nomination and selection process for officers of the Bureau and members of the Multidisciplinary Expert Panel (IPBES/1/INF/11).
3. In response to the letter circulated by the Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme dated 29 May 2012, in which he invited the members of the Platform, as part of an intersessional process, to propose appropriate candidates for officers of the Bureau, the interim secretariat of the Platform at the United Nations Environment Programme received the proposals summarized below.
