The crime Israeli aggression on Sudan

The value of the protection of civilians against the military targeting one of noble human values advocated by all civilized norms and guaranteed in all international and regional and local legal mechanisms and secured as well as in all tasks and functions of international and regional institutions.

On 10/23/2012 while the world celebrates the anniversary of the enforcement of the UN Charter, which calls for maintaining international peace and security. The population of Khartoum state was panicked at the twelfth midnight twenty-with a loud barrage of Yarmouk Factory where it fell a number of victims and wounded due to Israel's attack on the factory the Yarmouk industrial complex which located south of Khartoum, using eight military fighter jets, which led to the destruction of part of the complex and the residential area located next to the compound, sparking a state of terror among citizens, especially women and children, who scattered in the surrounding area in a scene they never had before. Although Israel has not publicly acknowledged committing the incident, but some Israeli newspapers and websites pointed to involvement.

Encroachment of the Israeli entity on Sudanese territory and targeting of civilians began in 2009, which the Red Sea state saw in its coast three Israeli military raids targeting civilians beside a military operation around Port Sudan. Israel entity's adopted the aggression.

These actions confirm systematic criminal behavior of the Israeli entity, which would support its operations in the occupied territories in Palestine.

The Maarij Foundation for Peace and Development strongly condemns what Israel used to do such attacks and believes that dropping Israel from punishment is paid to continue to conduct aggressive attacks which has no justification, and undoubtedly that the crime of aggression is a crime punishable by all international laws, norms and conventions and as stated in the definition of aggression fully applicable to the behavior of Israel (regardless of a declaration of war or not, the following acts are considered acts of aggression:

(a) The invasion or attack by the armed forces of a State of the territory of another State, or any military occupation, however temporary, resulting from such invasion or attack, or any annexation by the use of force of the territory of another State or part thereof;

(b) Bombardment by the armed forces of a State against the territory of another State or the use of any weapons by a State against the territory of another State;

(c) The blockade of the ports or coasts of a State by the armed forces of another State;

(d) An attack by the armed forces of a State on the land, sea or air forces, or marine and air fleets of another State;

(e) The use of armed forces of one State which are within the territory of another State with the agreement of the receiving State, in contravention of the conditions provided for in the agreement or any extension of their presence in such territory beyond the termination of the agreement;

(f) The action of a State in allowing its territory, which it has placed at the disposal of another State, to be used by that other State for perpetrating an act of aggression against a third State;

(g) The sending by or on behalf of a State of armed bands, groups, irregulars or mercenaries, which carry out acts of armed force against another State of such gravity as to amount to the acts listed above, or its substantial involvement therein.

The Maarij Foundation for Peace and Development calls on the Human Rights Council, backed by the High Commissioner for Human Rights to bring Israel and its leaders to international justice to bear their Criminal responsibilities toward the wasting of lives and property, security and safety of the Sudanese people, which violated by Israel. The General Assembly of the United Nations has issued a several resolutions condemning whereby the use of force, including decision as such which taken at its thirty-fourth in 1986 on the condemnation of aggression. The Maarij Foundation for Peace and Development Emphasizes assigning an individual responsibility for international crimes that have on people regardless of their attributes or immunities they enjoy, whether they are presidents or military leaders.
