#### Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Ali Achraf MOJTAMED (Islamic Republic of Iran)

1. At its 43rd meeting, on 5 December 1984, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statements by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/60, A/C.5/39/59, A/C.5/39/56, A/C.5/39/57 and A/C.5/39/58) on the programme budget implications of the following draft resolutions: draft resolution entitled "Relationship between disarmament and development" (A/39/745, para. 9), draft resolution entitled "World Disarmament Conference" (A/39/753, para. 8), draft resolutions B entitled "Study on the question of nuclear-weapon-free zones in all its aspects" and F entitled "Military research and development" (A/39/755, para. 29) and draft decision entitled "Study

on deterrence" (A/39/749, para. 68), and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/39/7/Add.10).

2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/39/SR.43).

#### DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 101 to 1, with 5 abstentions, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt the draft resolutions (A/39/745, para. 9, A/39/753, para. 8 and A/39/755, para. 29, draft resolutions B and F) and the draft decision (A/39/749, para. 68) recommended by the First Committee, additional appropriations totalling \$175,000 would be required under section 2B of the programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985, as follows:

In respect of the draft decision in A/39/749, para. 68	<u>34 500</u>

Conference-servicing requirements would arise which are estimated, on a full-cost basis, at \$1,167,000, as follows:

Against: United States of America.

Abstaining: Belgium, Germany, Federal Republic of, Israel, Netherlands, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

5. Statements in explanation of vote were made by the representatives of the United States of America, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Netherlands and the Federal Republic of Germany.

6. The representative of Honduras indicated that she had intended to vote in favour.
