1. At its 45th meeting, on 11 December 1984, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/64) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution VII recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 22 of its report (A/39/702) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/39/7/Add.11).
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/39/SR.45).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without a vote, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution VII recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 22 of its report (A/39/702), additional appropriations totalling \$222,200 would be required under the programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985, apportioned as follows:

An additional appropriation of \$9,000 would also be required under section 31 (Staff assessment), which would be offset by an increase of the same magnitude in the estimates of income under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment).

4. Conference-servicing requirements would arise which are estimated, on a full-cost basis, at \$1,958,200. The actual additional appropriations that might be required in that respect would be considered in the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing requirements to be submitted at a later stage during the current session.
