- 5. Comprehensive review of the whole question of peace-keeping operations in all their aspects (item 78).
- 6. Questions relating to information (item 79).
- 7. Question of the Malagasy islands of Glorieuses, Juan de Nova, Europa and Bassas da India (item 80).
- Question of the composition of the relevant organs of the United Nations (item 81).
- 9. Protection and security of small States (item 150).
- 10. Policies of apartheid of the Government of South Africa (item 28).

[The General Assembly decided that item 28 would be considered directly in plenary meeting on the understanding that the representatives of the Organization of African Unity and of national liberation movements recognized by that Organization would be permitted to participate in the discussion in plenary meeting and that organizations and individuals having a special interest in the question would be permitted to be heard by the Special Political Committee.]

With regard to item 127 (Joint Inspection Unit), the General Assembly decided that the item would be allocated to the Fifth Committee with the understanding that the reports of the Joint Inspection Unit dealing with the subject-matter assigned to other Main Committees would be referred also to those Committees. In the case of the Special Political Committee, the relevant report relates to agenda item 79.
