Letter dated 29 September 1989 from the Permanent Representative of
Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 22 August 1989 (A/44/472-S/20804), I have the honour to report that the Government of Pakistan has rejected the protest made by the Kabul authorities on 24 September 1989, in which it was alleged that from 16 August to 23 September 1989, a number of rockets were fired on Kabul city by opposition groups, at the behest of Pakistan.

The Kabul Chargé d'affaires in Islamabad was summoned to the Foreign Office on 28 September 1989 and told that the fighting inside Afghanistan was their internal affair. Pakistan has nothing to do with the rocket attacks and other skirmishes between Mujahideen and Kabul régime forces. Pakistan is fully abiding by the Geneva Accords and strictly follows the policy of non-interference and non-intervention in accordance with the international obligations.

The Chargé d'affaires was told that the Kabul régime should desist from making such incorrect and baseless allegations.
