REPORT OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE (A/7349)

1. Mr. MEYER PICON (Mexico), Rapporteur of the Fifth Committee (*translated from Spanish*): I have the honour to present for consideration by the General Assembly the report of the Fifth Committee on agenda item 98 [A/7349], an additional item which the General Assembly decided, on 18 November 1968 (1722nd meeting), to allocate to the Fifth Committee.

2. The Fifth Committee unanimously approved the draft resolution contained in paragraph 9 of its report and hopes that this Assembly will also approve it unanimously.

Pursuant to rule 68 of the rules of procedure, it was decided not to discuss the report of the Fifth Committee.

3. The PRESIDENT: I now invite the Assembly to turn its attention to the draft resolution recommended by the Fifth Committee [A/7349, para. 9]. Since the draft resolution was adopted unanimously by the Fifth Committee, may I take it that the Assembly also adopts it unanimously?

The draft resolution was adopted unanimously (resolution 2390 (XXIII)).
