I. Introduction

1. The previous recommendations made by the Fifth Committee to the General Assembly under agenda item 129 are set out in the reports of the Committee contained in documents A/67/673 and Add.1.
2. The Fifth Committee resumed its consideration of the item at its resumed 27th meeting, on 6 May 2013. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee's consideration of the item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/67/SR.27/Add.1).
