# Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects

#### **Report of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee** (Fourth Committee)

## I. Introduction

1. At its 24th meeting, on 11 September 2013, the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) resumed its consideration of the item. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee's consideration of the item are reflected in the relevant summary record (see A/C.4/67/SR.24).

2. For its further consideration of the item, the Committee had before it the report of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations (A/67/19).

# II. Consideration of draft resolution A/C.4/67/L.20

3. At the 24th meeting, the representative of Egypt, on behalf of Argentina, Canada, Egypt, Japan, Nigeria and Poland, introduced a draft resolution entitled "Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects" (A/C.4/67/L.20).

4. The Chair informed the Committee that the draft resolution had no programme budget implications.

5. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.4/67/L.20 without a vote (see para. 6).





### **III.** Recommendation of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee)

6. The Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

# Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects

The General Assembly,

*Recalling* its resolution 2006 (XIX) of 18 February 1965 and all other relevant resolutions,

Recalling in particular its resolution 66/297 of 17 September 2012,

Affirming that the efforts of the United Nations in the peaceful settlement of disputes, including through its peacekeeping operations, are indispensable,

*Convinced* of the need for the United Nations to continue to improve its capabilities in the field of peacekeeping and to enhance the effective and efficient deployment of its peacekeeping operations,

*Considering* the contribution that all States Members of the United Nations make to peacekeeping,

*Noting* the widespread interest in contributing to the work of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations expressed by Member States, in particular troop- and police-contributing countries,

*Bearing in mind* the continuous necessity of preserving the efficiency and strengthening the effectiveness of the work of the Special Committee,

1. *Takes note* of the report of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations;<sup>1</sup>

2. *Reiterates* that those Member States that become personnel contributors to the United Nations peacekeeping operations in years to come or participate in the future in the Special Committee for three consecutive years as observers shall, upon request in writing to the Chair of the Special Committee, become members at the following session of the Special Committee;

3. *Decides* that the Special Committee, in accordance with its mandate, shall continue its efforts for a comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects and shall review the implementation of its previous proposals and consider any new proposals so as to enhance the capacity of the United Nations to fulfil its responsibilities in this field;

4. *Requests* the Special Committee to submit a report on its work to the General Assembly at its sixty-eighth session;

5. *Requests* the Secretary-General to submit a report to the Special Committee at its 2014 session;

6. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its sixty-eighth session the item entitled "Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects".
