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PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1984-1985

Report of the Fifth Committee

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I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 21 September 1984, the General Assembly decided to include in the agenda of its thirty-ninth session the item entitled "Programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985" and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
2. The Fifth Committee considered the item at its 8th, 9th, 12th, 13th, 15th, 18th, 22nd, 25th to 28th, 32nd, 34th to 36th, 39th to 41st, 43rd to 47th and 49th to 55th meetings, on 10, 11, 16, 18, 22 and 29 October, 6, 12 to 15, 21, 27, 28 and 30 November, 3 to 5, 7, 11 to 15 and 17 December 1984.
3. The comments and observations made in the course of the discussion of this item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/39/SR.8, 9, 12, 13, 15, 18, 22, 25-28, 32, 34-36, 39-41, 43-47 and 49-55).
4. Section II of the present report contains a summary of the recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session on the revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the General Assembly either on the recommendation of its Main Committees or in respect of items dealt with in plenary meetings.
5. Section III of the report provides a summary of the special subjects considered by the Fifth Committee, other than the programme budget implications of draft resolutions, which led to the adoption of specific decisions (other than appropriations) to be recommended to the General Assembly.
6. The recommendations of the Fifth Committee are contained in section IV of the present report.

II. PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1984-1985

7. By its resolutions 38/236 A and B of 20 December 1983, the General Assembly approved appropriations for the biennium 1984-1985 in the amount of \$1,587,159,800 and estimates of income in the amount of \$283,892,800.
8. Recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session of the General Assembly on revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General, as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly under items considered by other Main Committees, have resulted in net increases in the approved level of appropriations in the amount of \$24,391,400 and net increases in the approved estimates of income in the amount of \$17,546,300.
9. The revised estimates of expenditure and income approved by the Fifth Committee and the financial implications of resolutions recommended by other Main Committees and subsequently approved by the General Assembly are indicated, by expenditure and income section, below:

III. CONSIDERATION OF SPECIAL SUBJECTS

1. First report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions

12. The Committee considered the first report of the Advisory Committee (A/39/7) at its 8th and 9th meetings, on 10 and 11 October.

13. At its 9th meeting, on 11 October, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note with appreciation of the first report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. I).

2. Parking in the United Nations Headquarters garage

14. The Committee considered this question at its 8th and 9th meetings, on 10 and 11 October, in the context of its consideration of the first report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/39/7).

15. At its 9th meeting, on 11 October, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend to the General Assembly that it endorse the recommendations contained in paragraphs 41 to 43 of the first report of the Advisory Committee (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. II).

16. At the same meeting, the Committee approved, without objection, a decrease of \$242,600 in the estimates of income under income section 3 (Revenue-producing activities) and an increase of \$43,900 in the estimates of income under income section I (Income from staff assessment).

3. Adequacy of the conference facilities of the Economic Commission for Africa at Addis Ababa

17. The Committee considered this question at its 12th meeting, on 16 October. It had before it two reports of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/38/82 and A/C.5/39/8) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/39/7/Add.2).

18. At the 12th meeting, the representative of the United States of America moved the adjournment of the debate on this question to a future meeting. The Committee rejected the motion by 73 votes to 21, with 2 abstentions.

19. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 83 to 3, with 13 abstentions, to recommend to the General Assembly the adoption of a draft resolution on the subject (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. III), and to approve the following appropriations under the programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985:

Section 32. \$ 3 120 000
Section 13. \$ 95 100

as well as an appropriation of \$16,300 under section 31 (Staff assessment), which would be offset by an increase of the same magnitude in the estimates of income under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment). The voting was as follows:

4. Financial arrangements between the United Nations and the Committee for the Promotion of Aid to Co-operatives

20. The Committee considered this question at its 15th meeting, on 22 October. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/3) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/39/7/Add.3).

21. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend to the General Assembly that, having considered the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/3) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/39/7/Add.3), it concur with the observations and recommendations of the Advisory Committee as contained in its report (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. IV).

5. Conditions of service and compensation for officials other than Secretariat officials

22. The Committee considered this question at its 15th and 52nd meetings, on 22 October and 15 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/38/27) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/39/7/Add.1).

23. At its 52nd meeting, on 15 December, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend to the General Assembly that it defer consideration of this question to its fortieth session (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. V).

6. International Computing Centre: 1985 budget estimates

24. The Committee considered this question at its 26th meeting, on 13 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/14). The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

25. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend to the General Assembly that it approve the 1985 budget estimates of the International Computing Centre, amounting to \$5,691,500, as contained in the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/14) (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. VI).

7. First-class travel

26. The Committee considered this question at its 27th, 28th and 40th meetings, on 14 and 15 November and 3 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/16).

27. At the 40th meeting, on 3 December, the representative of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/39/L.13*), which was adopted by the Committee without objection (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. VII).

8. Travel of United Nations officials to attend sessions of the General Assembly

28. The Committee considered this question at its 28th and 43rd meetings, on 15 November and 5 December. The report of the Secretary-General was presented orally by his representative at the 28th meeting of the Committee. Subsequently, the Committee considered a document (A/C.5/39/L.14) providing details of the travel of staff members to Headquarters in connection with the thirty-ninth session of the General Assembly.

29. At the 43rd meeting, on 5 December, the representative of Poland orally proposed a draft decision which the Committee adopted without objection (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. VIII).

9. Draft statute of the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research

30. The Committee considered this question at its 34th meeting, on 27 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/33), a communication from the Chairman of the First Committee addressed to the Chairman of the Fifth Committee (A/C.5/39/43) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/39/7/Add.8) recommending, inter alia, revisions to articles III, IV, VII and VIII of the draft statute of the Institute.

31. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 75 to 17, with 5 abstentions, to endorse the recommendations of the Advisory Committee with regard to the suggested revisions of article VII of the draft statute, as contained in paragraph 10 of its report (A/39/7/Add.8). The voting was as follows:

The Committee then decided, by 79 votes to 10, with 8 abstentions, to authorize its Chairman to inform the Chairman of the First Committee that the Fifth Committee endorsed the comments and recommendations of the Advisory Committee as contained in its report (A/39/7/Add.8), in particular the suggested revisions to articles III, IV, VII and VIII of the draft statute of the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research, as contained in paragraphs 10 to 13 of the report of the Advisory Committee.

10. Revised estimates under section 28G: Electronic Data Processing and Information Systems Division - Advisory Committee for the Co-ordination of Information Systems (United Nations share)

33. The Committee considered this question at its 35th meeting, on 27 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/35). The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

34. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend to the General Assembly that it decide that any additional appropriation that may be required in respect of the United Nations share in the costs of the Advisory Committee for the Co-ordination of Information Systems for the biennium 1984-1985 should be reported upon in the context of the programme budget performance report to be considered by the General Assembly at its fortieth session (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. IV).

11. Compensation in the event of death, injury or illness attributable to service with the United Nations and health insurance for members of commissions, committees and similar bodies

35. The Committee considered this question at its 35th meeting, on 27 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/36). The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

36. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/36) and that it approve the proposals of the Secretary-General contained in paragraph 6 of his report (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. X).

12. Industrial Development Decade in Africa: proposals to reimburse \$1 million drawn from savings in the 1982-1983 programme budget to initiate the activities called for in section II of General Assembly resolution 38/192

37. The Committee considered this question at its 35th meeting, on 27 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/42). The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

38. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to take note of the report of the Secretary-General and approved the transfer of \$25,100 from section 28M to section 17 of the programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985, as well as a reduction in the estimates of income under income section 2 of \$24,900.

13. Expansion of the conference facilities of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific at Bangkok

39. The Committee considered this question at its 39th and 40th meetings, on 30 November and 3 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/24) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/39/7/Add.7), as well as the text of a letter dated 27 November 1984 from the Permanent Representative of Thailand to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/62).

40. 42. At the 52nd meeting, on 15 December, The Chairman of the Committee introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/39/L.29) entitled "Use of consultants and participants in ad hoc expert groups", which read as follows:

"2. Decides to continue the interim measure instituted by its resolution 37/237, section VIII, of 21 December 1982 with respect to the amount of emoluments a former staff member in receipt of a periodic benefit under the regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund may receive under a contract or special service agreement in any calendar year."

43. At the 53rd meeting, also on 15 December, the representative of Belgium proposed that the title of the draft resolution be modified by inserting the word "experts" after the words "Use of" and that paragraph 2 of the draft resolution be replaced by the following:

"2. Confirms the interim measure instituted by section VIII, paragraph 3, of its resolution 37/237 of 21 December 1982 and decides to review the situation at its fortieth session in the light of additional information to be provided by the Secretary-General on former staff members of any organ, body or institution of the United Nations system in receipt of a pension benefit from the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund who are engaged by the Secretary-General in any capacity."

44. At the same meeting, the Fifth Committee adopted the amendments proposed by the representative of Belgium and the draft resolution, as amended, without a vote (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. XII).

15. Common services at the United Nations Office at Nairobi

45. The Committee considered this question at its 44th meeting, on 7 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/46). The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

46. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to take note of the report of the Secretary-General (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. XIII) and to approve a reduction in the estimates of income under income section 2 (General income) of \$341,700.

16. United Nations Office at Nairobi

47. The Committee considered this question at its 44th meeting, on 7 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/61). The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

48. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly approve the proposals made in paragraph 10 of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/61) (see para. 67, draft resolution I, sect. XIV).

49. The Committee continued consideration of this question at its 51st meeting, on 14 December, when it considered a note by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/39/97) regarding the offer made by the Government of Kenya to grant an additional 40 acres of adjoining land to the existing 100 acres at Gigiri. At the same meeting, the representative of Egypt introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/39/L.27).

Resolves that for the year 1985:

1. Budget appropriations in a total amount of \$US 817,971,300 consisting of \$US 793,579,900, being one half of the appropriations initially approved for the biennium 1984-1985 by General Assembly resolution 38/236 A of 20 December 1983, plus \$US 24,391,400, being the increase in appropriations approved during the thirty-ninth session by resolution A above, shall be financed in accordance with regulations 5.1 and 5.2 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nations as follows:

(a) \$25,972,100, consisting of \$28,570,700, being half of the estimated income other than staff assessment income approved for the biennium 1984-1985 by resolution 38/236 B of 20 December 1983 less \$2,598,600, being the decrease in estimated income other than from staff assessment approved by resolution B above;

(b) \$93,162 being contributions of new Member States for 1983 and 1984;

(c) \$791,906,038 being the assessment on Member States in accordance with General Assembly resolution 37/125 A of 17 December 1982 on the scale of assessments for the years 1983, 1984 and 1985;

2. There shall be set off against the assessment on Member States, in accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund in the total amount of \$US 133,499,074 consisting of:

(a) \$113,375,700 being half of the estimated staff assessment income approved by resolution 38/236 B;

(b) Plus \$20,144,900 being the estimated increase in income from staff assessment approved by resolution above;

(c) Less \$51,660 being the decrease in actual income from staff assessment compared to the revised estimates for the biennium 1982-1983, approved by resolution 38/226 B of 20 December 1983;

(d) Plus \$30,134 representing additional income from staff assessment in respect of adjustments for prior financial periods.
