Provisional agenda and programme of work of the Economic and Social Council for 2014

Annotations

I. Election of the Bureau

The General Assembly, in its resolution [68/1](#), requested the Economic and Social Council to adjust its programme of work to a July-to-July cycle with immediate effect and invited the Council to consider transitional arrangements for the election of its Bureau, taking into account the relevant rules, regulations and practices with regard to the work of the Council, its subsidiary bodies and the United Nations funds and programmes.

The Council, in its decision 2013/265, decided that the term of office for the next President and the four Vice-Presidents of the Council shall be from the date of election, to be held on 14 January 2014, until their successors are elected, which is expected to be at the beginning of the new cycle starting in July 2015, on the understanding that they remain representatives of a member of the Council.

According to the equitable geographical rotation of the office of the President among the regional groups, the President to be elected on 14 January 2014 should be the representative of a member of the Western European and other States. The four Vice-Presidents of the Council shall be elected from the other four regional groups, namely, the African States, the Asia-Pacific States, the Eastern European States and the Latin American and Caribbean States.

The President and Vice-Presidents shall constitute the Bureau. The Council, upon the recommendation of the President, shall decide on the special responsibilities of each of the Vice-Presidents.

The proposed date for the election of the Bureau is 14 January 2014.

The membership of the Council is given in annex I to the present report.



II. Adoption of the agenda, programme of work and other organizational matters

The Council's attention is drawn to paragraph 5 of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), in which the Assembly decided that the Council shall adjust its programme of work to a July-to-July cycle with immediate effect.

The Assembly also decided in its resolution [68/1](#) that the Council shall continue to have one substantive and one organizational session.

The provisional agenda has been prepared accordingly and is contained in annex II to the present report.

III. Substantive session

The segments of the substantive session of the Economic and Social Council will be as outlined below:

A. Operational activities for development segment

In accordance with paragraph 11 (a) of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council will hold an operational activities for development segment immediately following the first regular sessions of the executive boards of the funds and programmes of the United Nations system.

The proposed dates for the operational activities segment are 24 to 26 February 2014.

B. Integration segment

In accordance with paragraph 11 (e) of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council will hold an integration segment annually.

The proposed dates for the integration segment are 27 to 29 May 2014.

C. Humanitarian affairs segment

In accordance with paragraph 11 (b) of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council will hold a humanitarian affairs segment in June. The Council should also continue to hold a special event to discuss the transition from relief to development, to be convened immediately preceding the humanitarian affairs segment and following the annual session of the executive boards of the funds and programmes of the United Nations system.

The proposed dates for the humanitarian affairs segment and the special event to discuss the transition from relief to development are 23 to 25 June 2014.

D. High-level segment

In accordance with paragraph 11 (c) of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council will hold a high-level segment in July. It will continue to discharge the functions of the high-level segment of the Council as provided for in Assembly resolutions [45/264](#), [48/162](#), [50/227](#) and [61/16](#), in particular the biennial two-day Development Cooperation Forum. The segment will include the three-day ministerial meeting of the high-level political forum on sustainable development provided for in Assembly resolution [67/290](#).

The proposed dates for the high-level segment are 7 to 11 July 2014.

E. Coordination and management meetings

In accordance with paragraph 11 (d) of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council will hold dedicated coordination and management meetings regularly to perform the functions of the coordination and general segments as provided for in Assembly resolutions [45/264](#), [48/162](#), [50/227](#) and [61/16](#).

The Council will also schedule elections to fill vacancies in its subsidiary bodies during the coordination and management meetings.

The proposed dates for the coordination and management meetings are 23 to 25 April, 12 and 13 June, 14 to 16 July, and 17 and 18 November 2014.

F. Meeting on financing for development

In accordance with paragraph 13 of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council should continue to strengthen and further promote dialogue on and implementation of the financing for development agenda, inter alia, by strengthening existing arrangements, including the special high-level meeting with the World Bank, the International Monetary Fund, the World Trade Organization and the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development, to be held immediately following the annual spring meeting of the Joint Ministerial Committee of the Boards of Governors of the Bank and the Fund on the Transfer of Real Resources to Developing Countries held in Washington, D.C. The Council should also continue to allocate specific time for deliberation and consideration of the follow-up to the International Conference on Financing for Development.

The proposed dates for the meeting on financing for development are 14 and 15 April 2014.

IV. Organizational session

In accordance with paragraph 10 of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council shall continue to have one organizational session.

The proposed dates for the organizational session regarding the programme of work of the Council from July 2014 to July 2015 are 21 and 22 July 2014.

V. Youth and partnership forums

In accordance with paragraph 24 of the annex to General Assembly resolution [68/1](#), the Council should further promote the integration of youth into its deliberations, building on the past positive experiences of the informal youth forums. The Council should also continue with the informal partnership forum.

The proposed two-day partnership forum would be held between 8 and 10 April 2014. The proposed dates for the youth forum are 2 and 3 June 2014.
