CORRIGENDUM TO THE SUMMARY RECORD OF THE NINTH MEETING

Held at Lake Success, New York,
on Wednesday, 31 August 1949, at 3.00 p.m.

Page 3, line 4

Delete the words "could not object to such a request", and substitute "was fully in sympathy with the idea underlying this proposal".

Page 11, delete lines 20-28 and substitute:

"Mr. FLETCHER COOKE (United Kingdom) recalled that at the third session of the General Assembly the representative of the United Kingdom had stated in the Fourth Committee that his Government had had, and still had, no intention of transmitting information in regard to Section I of the Standard Form, since it maintained that there was no provision in Article 73 e requiring the transmission of such information. As then explained, however, the United Kingdom Government proposed to include in its replies under Section II such information relating to the geography, history, people of, and human rights in, each territory as it considered necessary for a proper understanding of the information transmitted under Article 73 e. It had complied with that undertaking in the information transmitted in 1949."
