Page 10

Paragraph 33: Replace this paragraph by the following:

"33. He was glad to acknowledge the frankness with which the Administering Powers had taken part in the discussion. However, with regard to the content of their obligations under Chapter XI of the Charter, he recalled Edmund Burke's words, spoken in the House of Commons 150 years previously in relation to British administration in India: 'It is of the very essence of every trust to be rendered accountable.' The same idea was, in Mr. Jobim's opinion, at the basis of Chapter XI, which included the accountability principle as an inseparable consequence of the trust given by civilization to the Powers administering Non-Self-Governing Territories. He was satisfied that, as the discussion in the Committee showed, the Administering Powers themselves were, in fact, aware of their responsibilities towards the Territories entrusted to them. It was then clearly the Committee's duty to examine the way in which they were fulfilling those responsibilities."

Paragraph 38

Line 1: Replace the words "defects in" by the words "deficiencies in the facilities for".

Lines 4-5: Replace the words "had been instituted" by the word "existed".

Paragraph 39, lines 2-5: Replace the words "he was not...indigenous students." by the following: "there were only one or two Territories in which there was any possibility of European candidates coming forward in any numbers. While in those Territories there might be a fair number of European holders of scholarships, the overwhelming majority of the total number was certainly indigenous."

Paragraph 40, lines 1-2: Delete the words "According to...fellowships," and begin the paragraph with "The classification...".
