NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

- 1. At the 71st plenary meeting of its thirty-ninth session, on 23 November 1984, the General Assembly adopted resolution 39/15, entitled "Adverse consequences for the enjoyment of human rights of political, military, economic and other forms of assistance given to the racist and colonialist régime of South Africa". 1/
- 2. In paragraph 5 of that resolution, the General Assembly
 - "Requests the Security Council urgently to consider complete and mandatory sanctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations against the racist régime of South Africa, in particular:
 - (a) The prohibition of all technological assistance or collaboration in the manufacture of arms and military supplies in South Africa;
 - (\underline{b}) . The cessation of all collaboration with South Africa in the nuclear field;
 - (c) The prohibition of all loans to, and all investments in, South Africa and the cessation of any trade with South Africa;
 - (\underline{d}) An embargo on the supply of petroleum, petroleum products and other strategic goods to South Africa".
