Mr. Eler (Turkey), introducing draft resolution A/C.2/68/L.20, on behalf of his own delegation and that of Pakistan, said that its main objective was to raise awareness of the contribution of pulses to food security and overall nutrition. Globally, 22 per cent of protein and 7 per cent of carbohydrates were obtained from pulses. Pulses were environmentally friendly, for they enriched and aerated the soil; moreover, once harvested, they were easily stored.

21. **The Chair** announced that the delegations of the Dominican Republic, Ethiopia, Niger, Sri Lanka and Ukraine had decided to sponsor the draft resolution.

24. **Mr. Elkaraksy** (Egypt), introducing draft resolution A/C.2/68/L.27, said that the delegations of Brazil, Bolivia, India, Niger, Saudi Arabia, South Africa and Viet Nam had joined the original sponsors listed in the document. The draft resolution reflected the conclusions of the report of the Secretary-General A/68/77, which confirmed that the ongoing Israeli occupation of the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, continued to deepen the economic and social hardships of the Palestinian people. It also requested the Secretary-General to report on its implementation during the sixty-ninth session of the General Assembly.

The meeting rose at 4.15 p.m.
