### WORLD SOCIAL SITUATION

#### Poland and Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic: draft resolution

#### Achievement of social justice

#### The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolution 42/49 of 30 November 1987 as well as Economic and Social Council resolutions 1988/46 of 27 May 1988 and 1989/71 of 24 May 1989,

Bearing in mind that, in accordance with the Declaration on Social Progress and Development, 1/ social progress and development shall be founded on respect for the dignity and value of the human person and shall ensure the promotion of human rights and social justice,

Convinced that more extensive international and regional co-operation is important for promoting social progress at the national level,

Mindful of the Guiding Principles for Developmental Social Welfare Policies and Programmes in the Near Future, 2/

Persuaded of the importance of taking measures to ensure co-ordination within the United Nations system in order to develop a comprehensive approach to developmental social welfare, including better integrated and mutually supportive economic and social development policies, aimed at the achievement of social justice,

1. Considers that the common purpose of the international community must be to forge from varied economic, social and political conditions a global environment of sustained development, full enjoyment of human rights and fundamental freedoms, social justice and peace;

2. Recognizes that social justice is one of the most important goals of social progress;

3. Reaffirms the importance of co-operation among countries in promoting a climate conducive to the achievement by individual countries of the goals of development and social justice and progress;

4. Considers that such co-operation should continue to be a major focus of activities of the United Nations in accordance with the principles of the Charter;

5. Calls upon Member States, in elaborating their national policy in the field of social development, to take into consideration the importance of achieving social justice for all;

6. Recommends that the Secretary-General, in preparing studies and reports on social problems and, in particular, the report on the world social situation, examine questions of the realization of social justice and ways of its achievement;

7. Requests the Commission for Social Development to continue to consider the question of achieving social justice at its next regular session under the existing agenda.
