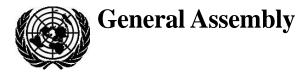
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### Estimates in respect of special political missions, good offices and other political initiatives authorized by the General Assembly and/or the Security Council

Thematic cluster III: United Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia

Twenty-seventh report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions on the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2014-2015

### I. Introduction

1. The Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions has considered the report of the Secretary-General on estimates in respect of special political missions, good offices and other political initiatives authorized by the General Assembly and/or the Security Council (A/68/327/Add.10), which contains the additional proposed resource requirements for 2014 for the United Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia (UNSOM). During its consideration of the report, the Committee met representatives of the Secretary-General, who provided additional information and clarification, concluding with written responses received on 28 April 2014.

2. The Advisory Committee recalls that the General Assembly, in its resolution 68/247 A, approved the total amount of \$596,826,600 for the budgets of the 36 special political missions authorized by the Assembly and/or the Security Council and also approved a charge totalling \$596,826,600 net against the provision for special political missions requested in section 3, Political affairs, of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2014-2015.





### **II.** Mandate and planning assumptions

3. UNSOM was established on 3 June 2013 by the Security Council in its resolution 2102 (2013). In its resolution 2124 (2013), the Council authorized the United Nations to provide non-lethal support to Somali National Army elements engaged in joint operations with the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM) through a trust fund, underlining that the support must be in full compliance with the human rights due diligence policy. The Council also mandated that UNSOM should support the Federal Government of Somalia in mapping the structure of the army; establish command and control systems; implement procedures, codes of conduct and training to ensure the safe storage, registration, maintenance and distribution of military equipment; finalize and implement a national programme on the treatment and handling of disengaged combatants and promoting respect for human rights; implement action plans on children and armed conflict; and assist the Federal Government in the development of an effective police force. The Council also signalled its intention to consider the deployment of a United Nations guard unit to strengthen security at UNSOM compounds, following which the Secretary-General proposed the deployment of a guard unit consisting of 410 personnel (see A/68/327/Add.10, paras. 1, 4 and 5).

4. In the report, the Secretary-General indicates that the guard unit will form part of the overall security concept of UNSOM by providing "inner ring" static protection for the compounds of UNSOM, located inside Mogadishu International Airport. The guard unit will comprise a guard battalion and an extraction and reinforcement team, supported by an adequately composed logistics company, with a total of 410 personnel. The logistical requirements for the guard unit will be a combination of United Nations-owned and contingent-owned equipment (see ibid., paras. 7, 8 and 10).

5. The Advisory Committee notes that the UNSOM guard unit will provide "inner ring" static protection inside Mogadishu International Airport. Upon enquiry, the Committee was informed that an amount of \$1,929,600 had been included also for security services within Mogadishu International Airport under the budget of the United Nations Support Office for the African Union Mission in Somalia (UNSOA) for 2014/15. The Committee was also informed that the reason why both budget proposals contained provisions for the same security services at Mogadishu International Airport was the sequencing and timing of the preparation of the relevant reports, in that the UNSOA budget proposal for 2014/15 (A/68/745, dated 11 February 2014) had been submitted before the proposed additional requirements for UNSOM for 2014 (A/68/327/Add.10, dated 28 March 2014). Taking into account this information, the Advisory Committee is of the view that the UNSOM and UNSOA budget proposals include double budgeting for security services within Mogadishu International Airport. In this regard, the Committee recommends approval of the requested resources under the UNSOM budget for those security services to be provided by the guard unit. For this reason, the Committee recommended against approval of the amount of \$1,929,600 for security services in the UNSOA budget (see A/68/782/Add.9, para. 32).

6. According to the Secretary-General, additional tasks in the rule of law and security institutions group include provision of support to the army, expansion of the demobilization, disarmament and reintegration programme into the regions, finalization of a multi-year rule of law plan, building capacity towards the

regulation of private security companies and support in the maritime sector (see A/68/327/Add.10, paras. 13-15).

7. Under human rights and protection, the Secretary-General indicates that UNSOM would support the efforts of the Federal Government to strengthen the army and provide technical support in compliance with the human rights due diligence policy. The Child Protection Unit would increase its presence in the regions and continue to strengthen political advocacy, capacity-building and the sensitization of key actors (see ibid., paras. 16-18).

8. With regard to the political affairs and mediation group, the Secretary-General states that focus will be on political inclusivity, constitutional matters, models of federalism and resource-sharing, national elections, institutional reform and good governance, and political outreach, in addition to support to the election process (see ibid., paras. 19 and 20).

9. In addition, UNSOM would support AMISOM in finalizing and implementing its gender strategy and the New Deal and stabilization team would assist the Federal Government to continue its stabilization efforts in locations already liberated (see ibid., paras. 21-25).

### III. Proposed additional resource requirements

10. The estimated additional requirements for UNSOM for 2014 amount to \$22,156,200 net (\$22,205,100 gross), which would provide for military contingents (\$6,916,400), United Nations police (\$139,300), international staff (\$572,600), national staff (\$55,000), United Nations Volunteers (\$53,500), government-provided personnel (\$41,600), consultants and experts (\$124,800), official travel (\$522,600), facilities and infrastructure (\$8,636,500), ground transportation (\$3,562,300), communications (\$215,700), information technology (\$30,700), medical (\$429,200) and other supplies, services and equipment (\$856,000) (see ibid., para. 26).

#### Staffing

11. The Secretary-General proposes 28 new positions to carry out the additional mandates referred to above, disaggregated as follows: 11 in the rule of law and security institutions group (1 P-4, 3 P-3, 1 Field Service, 2 National Professional Officer, 4 United Nations Volunteer), 5 in the human rights and protection group (1 P-4, 2 P-3, 2 National Professional Officer), 7 in the political affairs and mediation group (1 D-1, 1 P-4, 1 P-3, 4 National Professional Officer), 2 in the Office of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General/Gender Unit (1 P-3, 1 National Professional Officer), 1 in the Office of the Deputy Special Representative of the Secretary-General (1 Field Service) and 2 in the New Deal and stabilization team (1 P-3, 1 National Professional Officer) (see ibid., para. 27). Upon enquiry, the Advisory Committee was provided with a table showing the phased deployment of military, police and civilian personnel (see annex I).

12. The Advisory Committee was provided with information on the request for two United Nations Volunteer (Administrative Assistant) positions in Mogadishu in the Office of the Director of the rule of law and security institutions group. It was stated that they would perform functions such as planning, coordination and reporting, including supporting the Director in the substantive day-to-day operations of the sections within the group and providing substantive and legal briefs, analysis and regular reporting for the group. The Advisory Committee notes that there are currently six positions within the Office of the Director of the rule of law and security institutions group (1 D-2, 2 P-4, 2 Field Service and 1 Local level). In the light of the existing administrative assistant capacity within the Office, the Committee is of the view that the request for two Administrative Assistants is excessive and therefore recommends against one of the two proposed United Nations Volunteer positions. Any post-related operational costs should be adjusted accordingly.

13. According to information provided to the Advisory Committee, three new positions of Human Rights Officer (1 P-4, 1 P-3 and 1 National Professional Officer) are proposed under the human rights section to perform functions including supporting the implementation of the human rights due diligence policy. There are currently 18 positions within that section (1 P-5, 4 P-4, 5 P-3, 7 National Professional Officer and 1 Local level). Considering the general nature of the functions of the proposed new positions, and taking into account the current level of approved staffing of the section, the Advisory Committee is of the view that some of those functions could be absorbed within existing capacity and therefore recommends against the proposed Human Rights Officer position at the P-4 level. Any post-related operational costs should be adjusted accordingly.

#### **Operational** costs

14. The proposal of the Secretary-General includes a provision under consultants and experts in the amount of \$124,800. According to information provided to the Advisory Committee, the proposed requirements would provide United Nations/AMISOM coordination facilitation, monitoring and evaluation, stabilization assessment and analysis in 25 districts and electoral support. Upon enquiry, the Committee was provided with the following breakdown under this item for both the approved 2014 budget and the requested additional resources.

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15. The table shows that two persons and two trips are requested for the New Deal and stabilization team and that two persons are requested for the political affairs and mediation group (election) (Constitution). The Advisory Committee considers the proposed requirements for consultants and experts to be overestimated, considering the resources approved for 2014 in the amount of \$378,500 and the existing capacity within UNSOM. The Committee therefore recommends a reduction in the amount of \$25,200 under consultants and experts.

16. The Advisory Committee was provided with information on the additional resource requirements under official travel, in the amount of \$522,600. It was stated that the provision was related to anticipated additional travel at the political level to provide mediation support to resolve issues relating to federalism. The provision would be in addition to resources approved for 2014 in the amount of \$1,359,400 under official travel. Upon enquiry, the Committee was provided with tables showing planned travel as contained in the approved budget and in the proposed additional requirements (see annexes II and III). The Committee notes that some trips would be undertaken by more than one traveller at a time and that separate trips have been planned for the same destination. The Committee also notes that business class fares have been applied to travel for training, which should be undertaken as economy class travel pursuant to General Assembly resolution 67/254 A. The Advisory Committee is of the view that, taking into account the increased opportunities to use alternative means of communication, and given the reductions expected pursuant to General Assembly resolutions 65/268 and 67/254 A, the proposed additional requirements under official travel are not fully justified. The Committee considers that the Mission could increase its efforts to consolidate different meetings being held at the same destination and to minimize the number of travellers on any given trip. Consequently, the Committee recommends a reduction in the amount of \$94,100 under official travel.

17. Upon enquiry, the Advisory Committee was provided with information on the additional resource requirements under construction services, in the amount of \$3,280,000, for camp construction in Mogadishu. It is stated that the budgeting for the camp construction is based on historical data for similar works. The cost is some \$12,000 per person; however, consideration is given for proximity to existing facilities and access and security to those facilities for their utilization, meaning that the rate can be reduced to \$10,000. A phased deployment factor of 20 per cent is applied owing to the shorter implementation period.

18. The proposal of the Secretary-General includes a provision under governmentprovided personnel in the amount of \$41,600. According to information provided to the Advisory Committee, the proposed requirements would cover mission subsistence allowance and travel on assignment, rotation and repatriation for five governmentprovided personnel to be deployed in the security sector reform section to support defence sector reform for four months from September to December 2014. A vacancy rate of 20 per cent has been applied, in addition to the phased deployment schedule. Upon enquiry, the Committee was informed that the additional capacity comprised four colonels and one lieutenant colonel (P-5/P-4 equivalent), who would be deployed to Mogadishu (2), Baidoa (1), Jowhar (1, serviced from Mogadishu) and Garowe (1). It is stated that government-provided officers with expertise in operations, planning and logistics are essential to assist the army and AMISOM, and that governmentprovided personnel are a cost-effective way of drawing upon high-level professional expertise, given that the financial implications are limited to mission subsistence allowance and travel on assignment, rotation and repatriation. The Committee makes further comments on government-provided personnel in its report on crosscutting issues relating to peacekeeping operations (A/68/782).

### **IV.** Conclusion

19. The proposal of the Secretary-General for action to be taken by the General Assembly in connection with UNSOM is set out in paragraph 28 of his report (A/68/327/Add.10). Taking into account its comments and recommendations in the preceding paragraphs, the Advisory Committee recommends that the General Assembly:

(a) Approve additional resources for 2014 in the total amount of \$21,972,400 net (\$22,016,500 gross) for UNSOM;

(b) Approve a charge totalling \$21,972,400 net against the provision for special political missions appropriated under section 3, Political affairs, of the programme budget for the biennium 2014-2015.
