Sixty-ninth year****Letter dated 18 June 2014 from the Permanent Representative of
Cyprus to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General**

Upon instructions from my Government, I enclose herewith two separate annexes recording the infringements of international air traffic regulations and violations of the national airspace of the Republic of Cyprus by Turkey (see annex I) and the illegal use of closed ports by Turkish warships during the month of May 2014 (see annex II). It should also be noted that Turkish commercial aircraft systematically use the illegal Tymbou airport contrary to international rules and regulations.

Furthermore, I wish to inform you that during the months of April and May, Turkey and its subordinate local administration in the occupied territories of the Republic of Cyprus issued several illegal Notices to Airmen (NOTAMs), in an attempt to revoke NOTAMs previously issued by the competent authorities of the Republic. Turkey's actions not only stand in breach of international law but also seriously endanger safety and security in the reserved areas, as in one case they had been reserved for mine destruction explosions and, on two other occasions, for exercises conducted with live ammunition by the Danish Royal Navy.

Previously, in March, Turkey and its subordinate local administration illegally reserved an area in the north-west flight information region (FIR) of Cyprus, in which Turkish military aircraft conducted aeronautical exercises. This also occurred in late May. This latter incident greatly affected air traffic within the Nicosia FIR, especially flights from/to Larnaca and Pafos airports, as well as flights from Egypt to Turkey and vice versa.

Finally, in May, Turkey and its subordinate local administration, once again, issued an illegal NOTAM, following a NOTAM by the competent authorities of Cyprus regarding a request by the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP) to conduct demining. This latest action is indicative of Turkey's provocative attitude, demonstrating its unwillingness to cooperate even with the United Nations in order to promote its own narrow political agenda.



Turkey's actions are clearly aimed at undermining the Republic of Cyprus, emphasizing the continuing de facto division and upgrading the secessionist entity's status, by claiming a purported airspace over the occupied territory of the island. Additionally, Turkey continues to systematically harass civilian and military aircraft within the Nicosia FIR via radio calls. Meanwhile, Nicosia FIR infringements and violations of the national airspace of the Republic of Cyprus continue unabated. Turkey's policy of persistently breaching international law and defying international rules and regulations puts the safety of international civil aviation at risk, impacts negatively on the stability of the region and causes difficulties for air traffic in Cyprus. On behalf of my Government, I strongly protest the continuing infringements of international air traffic regulations and the violations of the national airspace of the Republic of Cyprus by Turkey and appeal for their immediate cessation.

I should be grateful if you would circulate the present letter and its annexes as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 42, and of the Security Council.
