General Assembly

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NOTE

The resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly are identified as follows:

Regular sessions

Until the thirtieth regular session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed by a roman numeral in parentheses indicating the session (for example: resolution 3363 (XXX)). When several resolutions were adopted under the same number, each of them was identified by a capital letter placed between the two numerals (for example: resolution 3367 A (XXX), resolutions 3411 A and B (XXX), resolutions 3419 A to D (XXX)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the thirty-first session, as part of the new system adopted for symbols of General Assembly documents, resolutions and decisions have been identified by an arabic numeral, indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution 31/1, decision 31/301). When several resolutions or decisions were adopted under the same number, each of them has been identified by a capital letter placed after the two numerals (for example: resolution 31/16 A, resolutions 31/6 A and B, decisions 31/406 A to E).

Special sessions

Until the seventh special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letter “S” and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 3362 (S-VII)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the eighth special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letter “S” and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution S-8/1, decision S-8/11).

Emergency special sessions

Until the fifth emergency special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letters “ES” and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 2252 (ES-V)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the sixth emergency special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letters “ES” and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution ES-6/1, decision ES-6/11).

In each of the series described above, the numbering follows the order of adoption.

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The present volume contains the decisions adopted by the General Assembly from 17 September to 27 December 2013. Resolutions adopted by the Assembly during that period appear in volume I, together with information on the allocation of agenda items. Resolutions and decisions adopted subsequently during the sixty-eighth session will be published in volume III.

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A. Elections and appointments

68/401. Appointment of the members of the Credentials Committee

At its 1st plenary meeting, on 17 September 2013, the General Assembly, in accordance with rule 28 of its rules of procedure, appointed a Credentials Committee for its sixty-eighth session consisting of the following Member States: BELGIUM, CHINA, COLOMBIA, GABON, GUYANA, RUSSIAN FEDERATION, SINGAPORE, UNITED REPUBLIC OF TANZANIA and UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

68/403. Election of five non-permanent members of the Security Council

At its 34th plenary meeting, on 17 October 2013, the General Assembly, in accordance with Article 23 of the Charter of the United Nations and rule 142 of the rules of procedure of the Assembly, elected CHAD, CHILE, LITHUANIA, NIGERIA and SAUDI ARABIA as non-permanent members of the Security Council for a two-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2014 to fill the vacancies occurring on the expiration of the terms of office of AZERBAIJAN, GUATEMALA, MOROCCO, PAKISTAN and TOGO.

At its 61st plenary meeting, on 6 December 2013, the General Assembly elected JORDAN as a non-permanent member of the Security Council for a two-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2014 to fill the vacancy arising from the decision of SAUDI ARABIA not to assume its seat on the Council.²

68/404. Election of seven members of the Committee for Programme and Coordination

At its 40th plenary meeting, on 30 October 2013, the General Assembly, on the basis of nominations by the Economic and Social Council³ and in accordance with the annex to Council resolution 2008 (LX) of 14 May 1976, paragraph 1 of Council resolution 1987/94 of 4 December 1987, as well as Assembly decision 42/450 of 17 December 1987, elected BENIN, CHINA, ETHIOPIA, HAITI and JAPAN as members of the Committee for Programme and Coordination for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2014 to fill the vacancies occurring on the expiration of the terms of office of ALGERIA, ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA, BENIN, CHINA, ERITREA, JAPAN and the REPUBLIC OF KOREA.

68/413. International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991

A

At its 53rd plenary meeting, on 18 November 2013, the General Assembly, pursuant to article 13 bis of the statute of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991, elected Mr. Koffi Kumelio A. AFANDE (Togo) as a permanent judge of the International Tribunal for a term of office beginning on 18 November and ending on 31 December 2013 or upon completion of the cases to which he was assigned, if sooner.¹⁴
