Letter dated 2 November 1989 from the Permanent Representative of Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 5 October 1989 (A/44/614-S/20887), I have the honour to report to you the following incident in violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side, which occurred on 27 October 1989:

"On 27 October 1989, the Afghan armed forces fired one Scud missile, which landed inside Pakistan territory in the Teri Mangal area of the Kurram Agency. No casualty or damage was, however, reported."

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was summoned to the Foreign Office on the morning of 1 November 1989 and a protest was handed over to him. He was asked to inform his authorities to refrain from violations of the Geneva Accords, otherwise the entire responsibility for the serious consequences would rest on the Kabul authorities.
