Follow-up to the commemoration of the two-hundredth anniversary of the abolition of the transatlantic slave trade**Letter dated 17 July 2014 from the Permanent Representative of Jamaica to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General**

I write on behalf of the Permanent Memorial Committee to provide an update on recent developments regarding the initiative to erect a permanent memorial to honour the victims of slavery and the transatlantic slave trade at United Nations Headquarters.

As you are no doubt aware, the initiative has received the unanimous support of Member States through annually adopted resolutions in the General Assembly, as well as by means of broad-based financial support to realize the completion of the project. The Secretariat has also been very supportive, including at the level of the Secretary-General.

Thanks to our collaboration with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization and the United Nations Office for Partnerships, the international competition to select a design for the memorial was run with utmost professionalism and transparency, utilizing the skills and inputs of industry leaders from various backgrounds and nationalities in choosing the winning design. Over the course of the past summer, the competition culminated in the selection of Rodney Leon's "Ark of Return" from among 310 entries representing 83 nationalities.

As you are well aware, the "Ark of Return" was unveiled on 23 September 2013 in a ceremony at which you participated, together with the President of the General Assembly and my own Prime Minister, in the presence of a number of other Heads of State and Government, ministers and other officials.

The Committee is now turning its attention in earnest to the construction and installation phases of the project. Working in collaboration with the Department of Management, we are aiming to realize the completion of the project in the shortest time possible. As you know, the ongoing capital master plan is currently focused on the General Assembly Hall and surroundings; it is our hope that the permanent memorial can be completed and installed in tandem with the completion of the work in that area.



To that end, the Permanent Memorial Committee welcomes the renewed support of Member States in order to realize the completion of the memorial. The United Nations Trust Fund for Partnerships — Permanent Memorial now stands at \$1,476,514. We urge Member States to give favourable consideration to making a new voluntary contribution to the Trust Fund to finance the completion of the project.

I have attached hereto a list of contributions to the Trust Fund as at 31 May 2014 (see annex), as provided by the United Nations Office for Partnerships (see [A/69/93](#)). Bearing in mind the noble and ongoing relevance of the purpose of the permanent memorial, supporting the completion of the project would serve as a show of commitment and demonstrate the united support of the global community to recognize and honour the victims of slavery and the transatlantic slave trade.
