I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. In accordance with the requests of the Fifth Committee 1/ approved by the General Assembly at its 203rd plenary meeting, on 17 December 1971, the present report on the composition of the Secretariat, in addition to recording the most recent staff changes, provides information on the implementation of General Assembly resolutions 2539 (XXIV) and 2736 (XXV), relating to the composition of the Secretariat, and on measures taken in regard to General Assembly resolution 2480 B (XXIII) of 21 December 1968 concerning a better linguistic balance in the Secretariat. It also includes a table showing the nationality composition of the staff in relation to the desirable ranges established for each country in the last 10 years.
- 2. As requested by the Fifth Committee, the date for the tables of statistics on the composition of the staff this year is 30 June instead of 31 August. The situation at 30 June 1972 is therefore compared with the situation as at 31 August 1971. For purposes of comparison with previous years, an addendum will be issued later showing the changes which have occurred between 1 July 1972 and 31 August 1972.
- 3. This report, as that of last year, contains no recommendations for consideration by the General Assembly at its current session. The Secretary-General has in mind putting forward proposals for changes in existing recruitment guidelines in next year's report on the composition of the Secretariat in the light of (a) whatever action the General Assembly will have taken on the report of the Special Committee for the Review of the United Nations Salary System 2/ and (b) any adjustments in the scale of assessments that the Committee on Contribution may recommend at its 1973 session.

II. CHANGES IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE STAFF

4. There were fewer changes in the period covered by this report than in previous years because of two factors affecting the composition of the staff. First, the revised reporting date of 30 June has reduced the period over which changes could take place from 12 to 10 months. Secondly, the Secretary-General, in the context of measures to improve the financial situation of the Organization, suspended appointments to posts in the Professional category and above financed under the regular budget for the six months of the period from January to June. The suspension did not apply in the case of appointments of staff for meeting already

scheduled and exceptions were permitted where it was essential to the proper functioning of the Secretariat.

- 5. Although the number of Member States has risen from 127 to 132, the number of nationalities represented in the Secretariat has remained unchanged at 122, of which five are non-member States. Nationals of Gabon and Equatorial Guinea, which were not represented at the beginning of the period, were appointed during the year; the latter nationality was represented in the Secretariat for the first time. The 15 Member States not represented in the Secretariat on 30 June 1972 were: Albania, Bahrain, Bhutan, Botswana, Central African Republic, Chad, Kuwait, Maldives, Mongolia, Oman, People's Democratic Mepublic of Yemen, Qatar, Rwanda, Swaziland and United Arab Emirates.
- 6. The largest net change in the distribution of staff by region occurred in North America and the Caribbean, which had 11 more staff members at the end of the period than at the beginning. Western Europe had six more staff members and Asia and the Far East four more. The largest net decrease was registered in Eastern Europe, which had nine staff members less at the end of the period, followed by Africa and Latin America, each with two staff members less, and the Middle East with one staff member less. Eastern Europe accounted for 52 of the 155 separations during the period, North America and the Caribbean for 28, Western Europe for 25 and Asia and the Far East for 21.
- 7. The percentage of fixed-term staff to career staff changed little, having risen over the period from 34.4 to 34.6. The regions in which the percentage increased were Latin America 3.6 per cent, North America and the Caribbean 0.9 per cent, Western Europe 0.6 per cent, and the Middle East 0.2 per cent. The regions in which the percentage decreased were Eastern Europe 0.3 per cent, Asia and the Far East 0.4 per cent, and Africa 3.7 per cent.
- 8. The number of female staff in posts subject to geographical distribution decreased slightly over the period from 343 (15.2 per cent) to 336 (14.9 per cent) and in posts with special language requirements from 217 (31.3 per cent) to 213 (30.3 per cent). The total number of female staff in such posts decreased from 560 to 546, from 19 per cent to 18.5 per cent. The appointment of one woman at the level of Assistant Secretary-General took effect subsequent to 30 June 1972.
- 9. A clearer indication of the trends discernible in the staffing of the Secretariat is given in the special table (table 19), included in the annex to this report, which shows the actual number of staff as compared to the desirable ranges of posts by nationality and region for each of the 10 last years. Since the figures for 1962 represent the position as it was just prior to the introduction of the present system of desirable ranges, pursuant to resolution 1852 (XVII), an analysis of the figures for the ensuing years brings out the effects of the policy guidelines laid down by the General Assembly 10 years ago. These effects, which in regional terms may also be seen from tables 1, 2, 3 and 7 of the annex, can be summarized as follows:

- (a) Largely as a result of the factor of membership in the Organization entering into the calculation of the desirable ranges, there has been a steady increase in the number of staff from countries in Africa (19.6 per cent) and the Middle East (102.0 per cent). The over-all increase in the number of Professional and higher level staff occupying posts subject to geographical distribution has been 78.0 per cent.
- (b) At the senior posts of D-1 and above, the increase of staff from countries in Africa has been from five in 1962 to 16 in 1972, Latin America from seven to 23 and the Middle East from none to 11. The total number of staff at these levels has increased from 145 to 266.
- (c) The shift in favour of staff coming from regions which have grown in the number of Member States is further shown by the target distribution of the staff as represented by the desirable ranges. The desirable proportion of staff from countries in Africa, as measured by the mid-point of the range for that region, has risen from 4.8 per cent in 1962 to 9.7 per cent in 1972. For the Middle East, that proportion has gone up from 1.9 per cent to 4.3 per cent. The actual increase in staff from the two regions has even exceeded the target, the number of staff from Africa having reached 10.5 per cent of the total, as at 30 June 1972, and the number of staff from the Middle East 4.6 per cent.
- (d) Concurrently, the desirable proportions of staff from countries in Eastern Europe, Western Europe and North America have decreased from 19.8 per cent to 16.4, from 23.2 to 19.4 and from 31.4 to 25.8, respectively. The actual number of staff from those regions has gone down in the case of Western Europe (from 23.2 to 19.4), has increased slightly in the case of North America (from 22.3 to 23.9), and has remained at about the same level in the case of Eastern Europe (11.4 in 1962 and 11.3 in 1972).
- (e) Seven of the 15 countries whose nationals were not on the staff of the Secretariat as at 30 June 1972 were represented on it at one time or another during the past 10 years. Of the remaining eight countries, five (Bahrain, Bhutan, Oman, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates) were admitted to membership in the Organization in 1971, one (Swaziland) in 1968, one (Maldives) in 1965 and one (Albania) in 1955. The principle of universality may thus be regarded as well reflected in the nationality composition of the staff.
- (f) While appreciable progress has been made in reaching the goal of equitable geographical distribution of the staff as laid down in the resolutions of the General Assembly, it has not been possible to eliminate all over-representation or under-representation. Even though the desirable ranges of posts for each nationality are no more than a guide for recruitment, rather than a precise indicator of how many staff members of any nationality should be in the Secretariat at any one time, it is evident that a number of nationalities remain well above or below what can be considered as equitable under the existing policy. The staff changes which have taken place, in the last 10 years do, however, point in the direction of continued improvement in the nationality composition of the Secretariat as a result of a better supply of candidates and more effective methods of recruitment.

III. MEASURES TO IMPROVE GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

- 10. The General Assembly, by its resolution 2539 (XXIV) of 11 December 1969 and resolution 2736 (XXV) of 17 December 1970, requested the Secretary-General to continue his efforts to achieve a better geographical distribution of the staff of the Secretariat at all levels. In the latter resolution, the General Assembly approved guidelines for the recruitment of staff. In applying these guidelines, efforts have been made to develop a long-term recruitment plan. This plan is dealt with in section IV below.
- ll. In the 1972 circular of vacancies in the Professional and higher-level posts transmitted to Member States, emphasis was put on the need to receive candidatures from countries which had an inadequate number of their nationals on the staff. The attention of Member States was drawn at the same time to General Assembly resolution 2715 (XXV), of 15 December 1970, which urged the United Nations and its related agencies "to take or continue to take appropriate measures to ensure equal opportunities for the employment of qualified women in senior and other professional positions", and to the Fifth Committee's request to the Secretary-General in its report to the General Assembly at its twenty-fifth session to encourage Governments of Member States to make available qualified women for positions in the Secretariat, particularly at the senior level.
- 12. At the four most senior levels of the Secretariat, five nationals of under-represented Member States (China, Japan, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) were appointed, four nationals of Member States within their desirable range (Denmark, the United States of America), and eight nationals of Member States whose representation is above the upper limit of their desirable range (Austria, Finland, France, Poland, Turkey and Uruguay).
- 13. Of the remaining 159 appointments, 42 were granted to candidates from countries which were below their desirable range, 50 to candidates from countries within their desirable range and 66 to candidates from over-represented countries, of which 15 were appointments to the regional economic commissions of nationals of countries within their region, 11 to the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) and nine to the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO). In view of the over-representation of these candidates' nationalities, 59 were granted fixed-term rather than career appointments. Among the staff appointed during the period was one national of a non-member State.
- 14. Special efforts were made in the case of the five Member States which were numerically furthest away from the lower limit of their desirable range, China (10 below on 30 June 1972), Italy (15 below), Japan (12 below), the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic (14 below) and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (60 below). Discussions were held with the appropriate permanent missions on ways to improve the situation. Recruitment missions were sent to Moscow, Kiev and Rome. On the latter mission, an informal recruitment commission was established with representatives from Government, institutions of higher learning and the United Nations to prospect for candidates.

- 15. In order to achieve a desirable proportion of 75 per cent of staff from the region and 25 per cent from other regions in the regional economic commissions, preference was given to qualified candidates from countries of the region which were not fully represented when no qualified candidate could be found within a reasonable period from comparatively under-represented countries. The regional economic commissions have continued to assist in the search for qualified candidates. Of the 48 appointments to the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA), the Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East (ECAFE), the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) and the Economic Commission for Latin America (ECLA), 27 were of nationals from within the respective region. The proportion of staff from the region in each commission was as follows: ECA 67.7 per cent, ECAFE 74.3 per cent, ECE 82.6 per cent and ECLA 66.4 per cent. Of these regions, Africa is within its regional range for the whole Secretariat, Asia and the Far East and Eastern Europe are below their range and Latin America and Western Europe are above their range.
- 16. For posts involving complex duties and responsibilities, preference was given to candidates who were willing to accept a career appointment or a fixed-term appointment of not less than five years. Thirty-six appointments were made to such posts during the period, seven on a probationary basis and three for fixed-terms of five years.
- 17. Following discussions with the Permanent Missions of Italy and Japan concerning the possibility of accelerating the appointment of staff from those countries by means of competitive examinations for recent university graduates, it was concluded that such examinations might best be organized in concert with other organizations of the United Nations family. If successful, this experiment will be extended to other Member States.

IV. LONG-TERM RECRUITMENT PLAN

- 18. The preparation of a long-term recruitment plan has been an objective sought by the General Assembly and by the Secretary-General since the Committee on the Reorganization of the Secretariat recommended it in 1968. With the aid of two outside consultants, a system for recruitment planning has been developed. For the information of the General Assembly, an outline of this system has been described in a separate report.
- 19. The 1972 recruitment plan, covering the period 1 July 1972 to 30 June 1977, is now being used as a quantitative guide for the recruitment of staff for the Secretariat. The 10 Member States with the largest desirable ranges are treated individually. The remaining Member States are grouped by region and according to whether they are, respectively, above, within or below their desirable range. This plan indicates that it would be statistically possible to bring all these geographical groups within their desirable range by the end of the plan period in 1977. Experience along will show whether in practice this will be possible, but it is clear from the analysis on which the plan was based that in some cases improvement can only be achieved over a period of several years. Budgetary

limitations, changes in the membership of the Organization, changes in the desirable ranges and fluctuations in the rates at which staff of different nationalities separate from service with the Secretariat will continue to make progress towards complete equity of geographical distribution a long-term goal.

V. LINGUISTIC BALANCE WITHIN THE SECRETARIAT

- 20. The incentives introduced in accordance with General Assembly resolution 2480 B (XXIII) with a view to ensuring a linguistic balance in the Secretariat came into effect on 1 January 1972. During the first six months, 634 staff members in posts subject to geographical distribution demonstrated their knowledge of a second language.
- 21. In response to the request of the Fifth Committee concerning the application of that resolution to staff members whose mother tongue is not one of the official languages of the United Nations, the Secretary-General authorized the inclusion of the names of 70 staff members who did not fulfil the language requirements, out of a total of 261, on the promotion registers from P-2 to D-1 for 1972. No register is prepared for the D-2 level. In preparing these registers, the efforts of staff to acquire knowledge of a second language and the training opportunities available to them were taken into account. In each of the 70 cases, the proficiency and technical skills of the staff members were considered to be of particular importance to the discharge of their functions.
- 22. In accordance with paragraph 5 of the resolution, the Secretary-General will submit a full report on the application of the language incentives to the staff of the Secretariat to the General Assembly at its twenty-eighth session.
