Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

- 1. The present addendum complements the 1989 annual report on operational activities of the United Nations system (A/44/324-E/1989/106) and provides information obtained from member states in compliance with the request made by the General Assembly in its resolution 43/197 of 20 December 1988 on the fulfilment of the target for official development assistance.
- 2. The target of 0.7 per cent of gross national product (GNP) of developed countries for official development assistance was adopted by the General Assembly in resolution 2626 (XXV) of 24 October 1970 on the International Development Strategy for the Second United Nations Development Decade and reaffirmed in its resolution 35/56 of 5 December 1980 on the International Development Strategy for the Third United Nations Development Decade.
- 3. A target of 0.15 per cent of the GNP of donor countries for official development assistance to the least developed countries, i.e., the doubling of official development assistance to those countries, was advanced in the Substantial New Programme of Action for the 1980s for the Least Developed Countries. 1/

ANNEX

Report of the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation on fulfilment of the target for official development assistance

- 1. In its resolution 43/197 the General Assembly requested the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation to include, in his report for the triennial policy review of operational activities for development, information on compliance with the resolution.
- 2. In implementation of that request, a note verbale dated 11 April 1989 was sent to all Permanent Representatives of Member States asking them to provide, at their earliest convenience but not later than 15 May 1989, the required information presented in accordance with a table annexed to the note verbale.
- 3. Twenty Member States responded to the note verbale. Information based on the responses of 16 developed countries is presented in the three following tables. Four developing countries Kiribati, Nepal, Dominican Republic and Saint Lucia also provided information, primarily on official development assistance received.
