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RECENT BASIC INDUSTRIAL INQUIRIES

I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The importance attached to industrial inquiries is shown by the great number of such inquiries that have been carried out during the past few years. In the annexes to this paper are listed over seventy countries in which an industrial inquiry was undertaken since 1952. This list, even though lengthy, does not give an adequate picture of the activity in the field, since repetitive inquiries (e.g., every year) have been shown only once and current inquiries are not included at all. The number of industrial surveys has risen markedly in recent years not only as a result of new programmes but also because of the increasing frequency and regularity of the surveys being conducted by those with an established programme.
- 2. The review of various national programmes indicates that there has been a growing standardization in the items of data sought and, to a considerably lesser extent, in the means of collecting these data. This trend toward international comparability may be attributable in part to the work of the Statistical Commission and the many international discussions of the past few years and partially to the fact that, in general, the data required for economic analysis varies only in detail or in emphasis from country to country. For purposes of international analysis, of course, any increase in the comparability of industrial data can be considered beneficial. The review has also brought to light a number of common problems and difficulties, an examination of which has led to the detailed changes suggested in Proposed Revisions to the International Standards in Basic Industrial Statistics.

II. SOME RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN NATIONAL PRACTICES

A. Trends in the Frequency of Surveys

- 3. The Statistical Commission has recommended that the developed system of basic surveys should include benchmark inquiries at infrequent intervals and annual surveys of a more restricted nature. The past few years has seen a number of countries moving toward such a system. Ireland and the United Kingdom, for example, have until relatively recently conducted a census of industry on an annual basis. At the present time, however, these countries have instituted sampling methods for the annual surveys and somewhat reduced their scope and made provision for a full census of industry only at infrequent intervals. Norway, Finland and Austria on the other hand have in the past relied solely on restricted annual surveys of large establishments for industrial data, but now have introduced an infrequent census of all industry, as part of a general economic census in order to obtain the benchmark data required.
- 4. Other countries e.g., Brazil, Burma, Colombia, Italy, Mexico and Turkey have now undertaken the establishment of an annual sequence of surveys to supplement industrial censuses already completed. India, however, whose vast area and dispersion of industry have made it impracticable to undertake a full census of industry, obtains data annually from a sample of the listed large establishments (those registered under the factories act) and supplements these data by the information for small units acquired through the annual National Sample Survey. In addition the annual census of twenty-nine important industries, begun some years ago, is continued.
- 5. A number of the above changes have come about because it has been found that while extensive data relating to the structure and activities of industry are necessary, these data are needed only infrequently and that a restricted survey of the field on an annual basis was needed to provide the global data for the intervening years. Also the realization that a series of well designed annual sample surveys based on an infrequent census could provide quickly the industrial data needed at a reasonable cost has contributed to acceptance of the recommended system of basic inquiries. The introduction of sampling has also had a salutary effect inasmuch as it has reduced the cost and bother to industry itself by limiting the number of units that are required to report on an annual basis.

B. The Statistical Unit

- Some of the more interesting changes instituted or being considered in 6. national programmes of industrial statistics have arisen out of questions regarding the appropriateness of various statistical units. These questions have centred around the relative roles of the establishment and the enterprise as a statistical unit in industrial surveys. 2 The interest in the enterprise as a statistical unit for industrial inquiries has been motivated by several considerations - prime among them being a desire to collect financial data related to the enterprise and physical data related to the establishment which could be compared and the difficulties that have been encountered by multi-unit enterprises in trying to allocate certain items of data among their constituent establishments. Because of such difficulties a number of countries are using or considering the use of the kind-of-activity unit, for which the restraint of a singular location on the establishment is removed, especially in annual inquiries or for the collection of items of data on inventories or capital expenditures. In these circumstances the requirements for data classified according to geographic area are minimal and the necessity of gathering data rapidly and economically is great.
- 7. The reports received by the United Nations Statistical Office indicate that there is a marked variation from country to country in the degree of difficulty entailed in requesting figures on an establishment basis. Reporting of annual capital expenditures for each establishment of an enterprise seems, for example, to pose no problems for industry in the United States, while some of the countries of Western Europe have found this to be one of the most troublesome items to collect on this basis.

In their 1950 census of industry, the Central Bureau of Statistics of the Netherlands made use of three statistical and tabulation entities - the enterprise, the local unit and the technical unit - in order to show the varying structure of industry and the inter-relationship of the parts. As a result of the reported difficulties of multi-unit enterprises in deriving the requested data from their records and a desire to collect financial and physical data in a related fashion, the Central Bureau of Statistics has undertaken to change the basis of reporting for the annual surveys to accord with the record-keeping practices of the various industries. This new technique of enumeration was inaugurated in the paper and paper products industry for 1955 and was extended to the manufacture of textiles for 1957 and of wearing apparel for 1958. In brief the new method consists of requesting an over-all report for the enterprise2/ and a subsidiary report relating to each of the major activities (kind-of-activity units) of the enterprise. An enterprise in the paper industry, for example, is asked to report raw material inputs and outputs for each of four activities pulp and cellulose manufacture, paper making, straw and fibre board manufacture and the manufacture of paper, cardboard, etc. products. To avoid burdening the respondent with the task of valuing transfers of materials between the reporting entities, inputs are divided into "purchases from outside the enterprise" (for which quantity and value are requested) and "materials received from other units of the enterprise" (for which only quantity data are requested). The valuation of this latter category is taken care of by the Central Bureau of Statistics. ('utput data is similarly requested Other items of data - wages and salaries, fuel purchases, power equipment, bsts, etc. - are requested only on an enterprise basis and from the over-all data thus reported the Central Bureau estimates the allocation to the separate activities. It should be noted that while the method adopted in the Netherlands annual survey does not provide data that are easily classifiable to geographic areas, information on employment is gathered

quarterly on an establishment basis from all enterprises included in the annual survey.

9. The indications are that the Federal Statistical Office of the Federal Republic of Germany is moving toward the complete adoption of an enterprise statistical unit for all its economic inquiries except the decennial general economic census of work places. The decision to discard the establishment concept is based primarily on the view that the reporting of certain flow data, particularly data connected with expenses, profits, investments and taxes can only be managed at the enterprise level and that further such data is meaningful only at this level. In addition it is felt that a classification of these data by narrow, homogeneous industry groups and by region is not required. 10. It is recognized, however, that the regional distribution of employment offered by economic units is important and for this reason it is intended to include questions on the number of persons engaged by local units in the general economic census. Aside from the questions relating to labour, the questionnaire for the 1960 census of workplaces will include only structural data - whether the unit is the principal or a branch unit, nature of the trade engaged in, the main activity of the enterprise of which the unit is a part, the legal form of the enterprise and perhaps queries which help to demarcate special sectors. It

is expected that the above data will allow for tabulation on both a local unit and an enterprise basis and that the data can serve as a check and a benchmark for more frequent special surveys into particular sectors of the economy. In addition it is understood that the collection of commodity output data on an establishment basis will be continued for the current inquiries.

11. Italy too, in the annual industrial surveys, has moved far in the direction of the enterprise statistical unit although it should be noted that these surveys are intended primarily for estimating capital formation and national income.

- 12. The countries of Eastern Europe have all adopted the enterprise as the basic statistical unit for industrial surveys and censuses. For these countries, however, the organization of the State-owned enterprises appears to be such that the enterprise corresponds, in all important respects, to the concept of the establishment i.e., the enterprise would be engaged in a relatively narrow range of activities and be located in one place. This is the case, for example, in Hungary, Poland and Yugoslavia. Further a number of the industrial returns deal with the structure of industry, technical equipment and commodity output and these often request data on a shop or plant basis. In general, the statistical reports required of each industrial enterprise are sufficiently detailed, with respect to the operations of each enterprise, that it seems likely that, if necessary, data could be aggregated for almost any kind of statistical unit desired. Such comprehensive reports are required, since these must also serve as the basis of detailed planning at all levels.
- 13. In the majority of cases, however, the reports and publications emanating from the various countries indicate a continued interest in and need for the collection and tabulation of data on an establishment basis and an intention to continue collection on this basis. This is due to the considerable need for data on the structure and productive activities (e.g., employment, output and key inputs) of industry classified according to relatively homogeneous categories of kind of economic activity and to the less urgent requirements for such data classified according to area or size. At the same time there has been a considerable effort directed toward refining the establishment concept so that it better fits the organizational realities of industry, extending the range of statistics gathered on industry to items such as financial transactions and status and proposed expenditures and forecasts through the greater use of the enterprise, and investigating the links that might be developed between establishment and enterprise data. Also, as was noted above, under circumstances where requirements for data classified by area or size are not great, there has been a tendency to substitute the kind-of-activity unit for the establishment. For example, the United Kingdom now uses this statistical unit in annual inquiries and a number of countries gather annual and more frequent data on inventories, capital expenditures and the like for the kind-of-activity unit.

C. Items of Data

- 14. In the course of developing their industrial statistics programme, the majority of countries have progressively expanded the scope of their inquiries to include all or most of the items of data recommended for collection and compilation by the Statistical Commission. Some countries have in fact gone beyond this point in an effort to collect such items of data as total value of capital equipment, complete costs, productive capacity, etc. items that have been omitted from the international recommendations because of conceptual and practical difficulties inherent in their collection.
- 15. In addition there has been a gradual accession to certain principles suggested by the Statistical Commission. Thus, for example, it is now common practice to request that all activities of establishments be reported even though some of these activities might be considered as outside the scope of the particular inquiry. Especially on the output side, it is now almost standard to request total receipts, from whatever source, as well as receipts arising from the sale of the establishment's own products. In line with this it has also become customary to request at least the total value of shipments of the establishment's products even if the detailed commodity output data is requested on a production basis.

- 30/ Data sought on combined value of "goods sold as purchased" and "other receipts".
- 31/ For industrial power generating plants with capacity up to 1,000 KW a survey is taken infrequently.
- 32/ Information was collected from about 43,000 enterprises; the degree of representation in the sample varied among the individual industries and size classes.
- 55/ For construction industries, data are sought on changes in inventories by stage of processing; for the other industries, data are sought on change of total inventories.

- 25/ Establishments, which on the average engaged fewer than 3 persons, reported only on the average number of persons engaged during the year.
- 36/ Data sought quarterly by means of sample survey.
- Detailed data are sought on number of buildings constructed, surface covered, floors added, apartments provided, and construction is further sub-divided by use into residential, rural, manufacturing, commercial and for other purposes.
