Sixty-eighth session Agenda item 19 (f) Sustainable development: Convention on Biological Diversity

Letter dated 28 August 2013 from the Executive Secretary of the secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity addressed to the Secretary-General

At its 10th meeting, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity addressed climate-related geoengineering and its impacts on the achievement of the objectives of the Convention as part of its decision X/33, on biodiversity and climate change. In response to that decision, three reports were prepared, compiling and synthesizing information on the impacts of climate-related geoengineering on biological diversity, the regulatory framework for climate-related geoengineering relevant to the Convention on Biological Diversity, and views and experiences of indigenous and local communities and stakeholders. The texts of the decisions are available at http://www.cbd.int/decisions/.

At its 11th meeting, the Conference of the Parties, in its decision XI/20, requested the Executive Secretary to disseminate the reports referred to above as widely as possible, identifying a number of treaties and organizations, specifically the United Nations General Assembly. Pursuant to that request, I have the honour to share with you, for the information of the Assembly, the links to the reports:
