Additional Note by the Secretary-General

In his Note E/2818 dated 12 January 1956, the Secretary-General listed in paragraph 2 the Governments which have become parties to the 1949 Convention on Road Traffic, numbering nineteen in all.

Since the issue of that document, four more Governments have become parties to the Convention. The complete list of the parties, as of 25 April 1956, is therefore as follows (countries underlined are those which have been added): Austria, Australia, Belgium, Cambodia, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Greece, Israel, Italy, Luxembourg, Monaco, Netherlands, Philippines, Portugal, Sweden, Syria, Turkey, Union of South Africa, United States of America, Vatican City State, and Viet Nam.
