Minister for Foreign Affairs: Saudi Arabia intends to establish an integrated centre to coordinate assistance efforts for the Yemeni people

The Minister for Foreign Affairs, Adel bin Ahmed al-Jubeir, recently stated that, in the light of ongoing and intensified efforts to deliver humanitarian assistance within Yemeni territory, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia was consulting with the members of the coalition defending the legitimate authority in Yemen and with all supporting States to establish specific areas within Yemeni territory where humanitarian assistance could be delivered. All air operations would be interrupted in those areas at specified times for the delivery of aid in accordance with Security Council resolution 2216 (2015).

He warned the Houthi militias and affiliated forces against exploiting the cessation of air operations, preventing the delivery of aid or attempting to use it for their own benefit. He stressed that Saudi Arabia would react to any violation by resuming air strikes against any enemy deployment hindering humanitarian efforts.

The Minister said that Saudi Arabia intended to establish an integrated centre on its own territory with a view to delivering assistance to the Yemeni people. The centre would coordinate all assistance delivery efforts involving the United Nations, the relevant international organizations and States wishing to provide assistance to the Yemeni people. Its tasks would include enabling the United Nations to deliver the \$274 million in assistance pledged by the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Salman Bin Abdulaziz Al-Saud.
