Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. In accordance with relevant Economic and Social Council resolutions and in particular resolution 1986/35, the Commission on Human Rights at its forty-sixth session, is called upon to elect half of the Sub-Commission membership and the corresponding alternates, if any, whose term of office should expire after two years in accordance with the following pattern: three members from African States; three members from Asian States; one member from Eastern European States; three members from Latin American States and three members from Western European and other States.
2. The Secretary-General, in document E/CN.4/1990/48, informed the Commission of the nominations of candidates and alternates for election to the Sub-Commission received as at 23 October 1989. That document also contained the biographical data of candidates and alternates which had been received.
3. Additional nominations and biographical data have been received since 23 October 1989. The present document contains the updated list of nominations for membership of the Sub-Commission as at 20 November 1989. This document also includes biographical data not reproduced in document E/CN.4/1990/48 and/or received since 23 October 1989 (see annex).
4. Further communications and nominations received subsequent to the date of the present document will be reproduced in addenda.
