1. Consideration of Transfer to United Nations of Functions and Powers Previously Exercised by the League of Nations under the International Conventions for the Suppression of Traffic in Women and Children of 30 September 1921 and 11 October 1933, and the International Conventions for the Suppression of Circulation and Traffic in Obscene Publications of 12 September 1923. (Document E/540)

The CHAIRMAN pointed out that the drafting committee had made certain changes in the Conventions which were necessary from the procedural point of view, and had taken into account the United Kingdom and United States amendments.

- (e) Consideration of Changes made in the Convention for the Suppression of Traffic in Women of Full Age of 11 October 1933.

- (f) Draft Protocol to Amend the Convention of 12 September 1923 for the Suppression of Circulation and Traffic in Obscene Publications.

The draft protocol was adopted.

- (g) Consideration of Changes made in the Convention for the Suppression of Circulation and Traffic in Obscene Publications of 12 September 1923.

The changes which had been made were approved.

- (h) Draft Resolution Submitted by Secretary-General

The draft resolution was adopted.

- (i) Draft Resolution Proposed by the Delegation of Norway.

The draft resolution was adopted.

Mr. BORISOV (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) asked that it be recorded that, as regards the Convention of 1921 for the Suppression of the Traffic in Women and Children and the Convention of 1933 for the Suppression of the Traffic in Women of Full Age to which the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics was not a Party, he had abstained from voting. His abstention also applied to the draft resolution on page 15 of document E/540.
