Freedom of expression and peaceful assembly

The General Assembly,

<u>Guided</u> by the rurposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations and bearing in mind the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, 1/

Aware of its responsibility to promote and encourage respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms and determined to remain vigilant with regard to violations of human rights wherever they occur,

Recalling articles 19 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, 2/

Mindful of the Code of Conduct for Law Enforcement Officials, 3/

Noting the pertinent resolutions of the Commission on Human Rights, most recently its resolution 1989/31 6 March 1989, 4/ on the right to freedom of opinion and expression,

<u>Seriously concerned</u> over recent reports from different regions of the world on the quelling of peaceful assemblies and demonstrations,

- 1. Expresses its concern at the extensive occurrence in many parts of the world of the use of force against and the detention of persons who exercise the rights to freedom of opinion and expression and of peaceful assembly as affirmed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;
- 2. <u>Calls upon</u> all States faled with peaceful assemblies and demonstrations to respect generally accepted norms of international law;
- 3. Appeals to all States to ensure respect for the rights of all persons who exercise the right to freedom of opinion and expression and, where any persons have been detained solely for exercising the right to freedom of opinion and expression as laid down in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, to release them immediately.
