CORRIGENDUM TO THE SUMMARY RECORD OF THE FORTY-NINTH MEETING

Held at Lake Success, New York  
on Friday, 23 April 1948 at 3 p.m.

On page 13, delete the remarks by Mr. POLLOCK (Canada) and substitute the following:

Mr. Pollock (Canada) wished to add another question for the Secretary on the subject of "allocation of functions", which had been the subject of discussion by a number of previous speakers. At the last session of the Economic and Social Council there had been a great deal of discussion in the Committee on Co-ordination on ways for eliminating conflicts and duplications between specialized agencies and other United Nations organs in fields like development where many bodies had responsibilities which might overlap. In the resolution prepared by the Committee and subsequently passed by the Council, the Secretary-General was called upon, inter alia to "submit not later than 1 June of each year to the members of the Economic and Social Council a report to include an account of the current work programmes of the Economic and Social Departments and of the Commissions of the Council, with a description, where applicable, of their relationship to similar activities carried on by the specialized agencies and other organs of the United Nations" (document E/765 of 10 March 1948, Resolution II C 2). Would not a more precise formulation of the Sub-Commission's work programme be necessary to enable the Secretary-General to provide the information called for in that resolution?

On page 14, amend the last sentence in Mr. Pollock's remarks to read:

"He felt that the Sub-Commission might be asked to comment on its capacity to perform those functions."
