Economic and technical co-operation among developing countries

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolution 33/134 of 19 December 1978, in which it endorsed the Buenos Aires Plan of Action for Promoting and Implementing Technical Co-operation among Developing Countries and other relevant resolutions of the General Assembly,

Emphasizing the important role that technical co-operation among developing countries plays in the growth and development of developing countries,

Reaffirming the responsibilities of all parties concerned for the implementation and promotion of the Buenos Aires Plan of Action,

Reaffirming also the catalytic role of the United Nations system in the implementation of the Buenos Aires Plan of Action,

1. Reiterates the continued validity of all the recommendations of the Buenos Aires Plan of Action for Promoting and Implementing Technial Co-operation among Developing Countries, 1/ and the importance of the activities on technical co-operation among developing countries;

- 2. Reiterates also the continued validity of the High-level Committee on the Review of Technical Co-operation among Developing Countries as the only forum in which representatives of all the States Members of the United Nations review and promote technical co-operation among developing countries;
- 3. <u>Endorses</u> the decisions adopted by the High-level Committee at its sixth session; 2/
- 4. <u>Urges</u> all Member States, the United Nations Development Programme and other relevant organs and organizations of the United Nations system to give high priority to the support and promotion of activities in technical co-operation among developing countries.
