ANNEX

Declaration on the situation in South Africa adopted on 25 March 1985 by the Ministers for Foreign Afrairs of the Ten States members of the European Community

The Ten States members of the European Community express their deep concern about the tension which is developing in South Africa because of the campaign of indiscriminate repression being conducted against the black population.

They firmly condemn, in particular, the behaviour of units of the police force in the events of 21 March at Uitenhage, which caused the death of many black residents.

The Ten, recalling the Ministerial Declaration of 11 September 1984, a/reaffirm their appeal for an end to the system of apartheid and for a process of dialogue which might lead to substantial reforms with a view to responding to the legitimate aspirations of the black population.
