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> INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL RESPONSIBILITY OF INDIVIDUALS AND ENTITIES ENGAGED IN ILLICIT TRAFFICKING IN NARCOTIC DRUGS ACROSS NATIONAL FRONTIERS AND OTHER TRANSNATIONAL CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES: ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL COURT WITH JURISDICTION OVER SUCH CRIMES

Antigua and Barbuda, Bohamas, Barbados, Belize, Comoros, Costa Rica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Papua New Guinea, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago and Vanuatu: draft resolution

International criminal responsibility of individuals and entities engaged in illicit trafficking in narcotic drugs across national frontiers and other transnational criminal activities: establishment of an international criminal court with jurisdiction over such crimes

The General Assembly,

<u>Mindful</u> that, in accordance with Article 13, paragr\_p?. 1 (a), of the Charter of the United Nations, the General Assembly is called upon to initiate studies and make recommendations for the purpose of encouraging the progressive development of international law and its codification,

<u>Recognizing</u> that there is an established link between the illicit trafficking in narcotic drugs and other organized criminal activities which endanger the constitutional order of States and violate basic human rights,

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<u>Mindful</u> of the adoption on 20 December 1988 of the United Nations Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances, 1/ which recognizes that the illicit trafficking in drugs is an international criminal activity,

Bearing in mind the need to keep under review those topics of international law which, given their new or renewed interest for the international community, may be suitable for the progressive development and codification of international law,

2. Requests the Secretary-General to transmit to the International Law Commission any views expressed by Member States pursuant to paragraph 3 of resolution 44/- [A/C.6/44/L.11], as well as the summary records of the debate on the present agenda item during the forty-fourth session of the General Assembly;

3. <u>Decides</u> to consider the question of establishing such an international criminal court or other international criminal trial mechanism at its forty-fifth session when examining the report of the International Law Commission.
