## Addendum to note by the Secretary-General

Additional information\* from the Danish Government concerning the recommendations of the International Chamber of Commerce listed in document  $\mathbb{E}/\mathbb{C}.2/59$  has been received after the fourth session of the Transport and Communications Commission. It is given below.

## Denmark

At the Danish-German border where the office hours of the customs houses are fixed by mutual agreement the houses are open at the hours when ordinary traffic goes on.

At frontiers with ordinary public traffic by railroad-ferry the office hours of the customs houses have been extended with a view to serve all ordinary traffic,

At all other customs houses the office hours are set from 8 a.m. to 5 r.m.: for economic reasons it would be difficult for the time being to have them extended.
