CORRIGENDUM TO THE SUMMARY RECORD OF THE SEVENTEENTH MEETING

Lake Success, New York

Wednesday, 3 March 1948, at 10.30 a.m.

The following corrections should be made in Mr. ORDONNEAU's speech:

Page 9 - Paragraph 3 should read:

"These two aspects of the work of the United Nations were both visible in the institutions set up by the Charter. The powers of the Assembly were very general but limited in scope. Hence..."

Page 9 - Paragraph 4, sixth line, should read:

"...the International Court of Justice only dealt with disputes of a juridical nature which Members of the United Nations had agreed by a general or special clause to submit to it.

Page 10 - The end of Paragraph 4 should read:

"It contained political, economic and legal elements and only a single organization..."

(Page 10 - Paragraph 5, line 9. This corrigendum does not apply to the English text).

Page 11 - The end of paragraph 1 should read:

"...with which, as such, the Economic and Social Council might be called upon to deal on a United Nations basis".

Page 11 - Paragraph 2 should read:

"The very narrow terms in which.....".

Page 11 - Paragraph 2 should read:

"...under this exceptional heading, quite the opposite in fact. Neither should it be forgotten that it was always possible to conjure up some arbitrary connection between a dispute and general and international considerations".

Page 11 - Paragraph 3, line 5, should read:

"...and by this very act a purely legal problem was raised,
