Question of the future of Ruanda-Urundi: report of the United Nations Commission for Ruanda-Urundi (A/4856, A/4865 and Corr.1, A/4970, A/4994 and Add.1 and Corr.1, A/5086; A/C.4/516 and Add.1, 517 and Corr.1, 522 and Add.1-4, 532 and Corr.1, 533-535) (continued)

- 1. Mr. KAKITSUBO (Japan) proposed that the meeting should be adjourned to allow the members of the African-Asian group to complete the preparation of the draft resolution on which they were working. He was confident that the final draft would be ready in time to enable the Committee to meet on Wednesday, 14 February, at 3 p.m.
- 2. Mr. CARPIO (Philippines) and Mr. ACHKAR (Guinea) supported the Japanese representative's proposal.
- 3. In reply to a question from Mr. HOOD (Australia), the CHAIRMAN said that she hoped that the Committee would be able to complete its work by 23 February at the latest.
- 4. In reply to a question from Mr. ACHKAR (Guinea), the CHAIRMAN said that, although the general debate on the question of Ruanda-Urundi had been concluded, that did not mean that the Committee had completed its work. If the Committee had no draft resolution before it at the afternoon meeting on 14 February, it would have to take up the remaining questions on the agenda.

The Japanese representative's proposal was adopted.
