The following communication is listed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 of Rule 81 of the Rules of Procedure of the Council.

International Law Association.

In a communication dated 19 July 1949 addressed to the Secretary-General, the International Law Association submitted observations to the report of the Fifth Session of the Commission on Human Rights requesting that these be brought to the attention of the members of the Economic and Social Council and of the Commission on Human Rights.⁽¹⁾

The I.L.A. submits that point (a) of paragraph 27(c) of the Commission's report⁽²⁾ be amended. It is suggested that "when the Commission is not sitting and matters of principle entrusted to the Commission are being dealt with, by the General Assembly or other principal organs of the United Nations, the communications which would normally be addressed to the Commission shall be laid before the organ actively concerned."

In its communication the International Law Association points out that it did much work on the subject of Human Rights, both by written communications and by conference resolutions.

The organization finally suggests that the Secretary-General should use his right under Rule 63 of the General Assembly's rules of procedure to forward communications from the International Law Association to the General Assembly.
