IMPLEMENTATION OF RECOMMENDATIONS ON
ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL MATTERS

UNITED STATES: Proposed time-table for reporting on
implementation of resolutions

1. April 1950 - The Secretary-General sends out a request for reports from Member Governments on resolutions adopted at the 1948 General Assembly and the 8th and 9th sessions of ECOSOC (1949).
(This would be the resolutions contained in E/AC.31/1 as classified by this Ad Hoc Committee)
2. October 1950 - Reports are due from Member Governments to the Secretary-General on implementation of the resolutions as requested in April 1950. (All reports should be distributed to Members as soon as received by the Secretary-General).
3. December 1950 - The Secretary-General should submit report to the Council, making an "index of replies" as now contained in E/1325, but also making suggestions as to which resolutions require no further reports, which had not been effective and should be reconsidered, etc...
4. January 1951 - ECOSOC (or Ad Hoc Committee) consider reports and suggest to General Assembly (or ECOSOC) which resolutions need no further reports, which resolutions not implemented, etc...
5. April 1951 - The Secretary-General sends out a request for reports from Member Governments on resolutions adopted at the 1949 General Assembly and the 10th and 11th sessions of ECOSOC (1950).
6. September 1951 - General Assembly considers report of winter 1951 ECOSOC.
7. October 1951 - Reports of Members due in reply to request of April 1951.
(This pattern to be repeated each year.)
