## International Civil Service Commission

## Note by the Secretary-General

1. The resignation of Mr. Raúl Quijano (Argentina) as Chairman of the International Civil Service Commission, raises the question of filling that vacancy on the Commission for the remainder of the former Chairman's term, that is, until 31 December 1982.

2. In accordance with the provisions of Article 4 of the Statute of the Commission, the Secretary-General, in his capacity as Chairman of the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination, is required to undertake consultations with Member States, with the Executive Heads of the other organizations and with the staff representatives. In addition, he is required to consult with the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions.

3. The Secretary-General regrets to have to inform the General Assembly that it has not proven possible, despite all efforts, to complete the consultation process necessitated by the resignation of Mr. Quijano in time to permit him to submit recommendations for the consideration and decision of the General Assembly at the current session. He will therefore continue his efforts with a view to submitting recommendations to the thirty-fifth session of the General Assembly.

In order to enable the Commission to function with the composition foreseen In Article 2 of its Statute, that is with 15 members of whom two are to serve full time, the Secretary-General, having consulted the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, proposes that provisionally until a Chairman is appointed by the General Assembly at its thirty-fifth session Mr. Gastón de Prat Gay of Argentina should be appointed to the Commission and to serve, on an exceptional basis, full-time as acting Vice-Chairman. The curriculum vitae of Mr. de Prat Gay is attached.
