Measures to eliminate international terrorism

Identical letters dated 22 December 2015 from the Permanent Representative of the Syrian Arab Republic to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General and the President of the Security Council

On instructions from my Government, I should like to convey to you the following information.

We should like to refer to our previous letters, in particular the letter issued under symbol S/2015/933, concerning the ongoing attacks by aircraft of the so-called international coalition led by the United States of America against the oil and gas installations and the economic infrastructure of Syria, under the pretext that the target is the Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) terrorist organization. Such attacks violate the sovereignty of the Syrian Arab Republic. On Tuesday, 8 December 2015, aircraft belonging to that coalition bombed the Kubaybah oil terminal, which belongs to the Kawkab Petroleum Company, in Hasakah governorate. The attack resulted in the destruction of two 5,000 m³ refined oil storage tanks; six 1,000 m³ oil gathering tanks; the terminal's buildings and control systems; and the camp of the Chinese company that built the terminal.

On that same date, aircraft of the so-called coalition also bombed the administration and control building of the Markadah gas terminal of the Syrian Gas Company. The bombing of this terminal is unjustified given that it only processes raw gas; there is no oil there that could be stolen.

On Sunday, 13 December 2015, aircraft of the so-called coalition bombed the Sector 24 gas pipeline, which supplies an electrical power station in the Umar field. The attack cut off the supply of gas to the Dayr al-Zawr gas plant and took it out of service.

Those attacks by the so-called international coalition were preceded by a series of other attacks that caused significant economic losses and material damage, which are estimated to amount to hundreds of millions of dollars. Following is a listing of some of those attacks:



- On 30 October 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the oil collection terminal in the Umar field, Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 3 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the Umar, Tanak and Jidu fields in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 4 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the perimeter of the Umar field in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 30 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the Tanak field in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 8 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked Abu Hardan well No. 136 and Barghuth wells Nos. 106, 108 and 120 in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 9 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked sites belonging to the Furat Petroleum Company in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 9 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked eight oil relay pumps, as well as the pumps' meters and auxiliary equipment, at the main Jafra terminal in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 9 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the Umar gas plant, the main oil collection point in the Umar field, collection substation GSA near the Umar gas plant and collection substation GSB in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 14 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked sites in the Umar field in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 15 November 2015, coalition aircraft bombed the garage of the Jafra terminal in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 17 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the Umar, Malih, Sayjan and Azraq fields in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 19 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked sites at the Jafra terminal in Dayr al-Zawr governorate.
- On 19 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the Taym field in Dayr al-Zawr governorate, causing a fire.
- On 5 and 6 November 2015, coalition aircraft attacked the main terminals of the Taym and Ward fields, and oil wells at the Umar field in Dayr al-Zawr governorate, setting some of the wells on fire.

Aircraft of the coalition led by the United States of America have carried out dozens of attacks against Syrian economic facilities, instead of bombing ISIL and that group's vehicles, which are transporting stolen Syrian oil to Turkey. The coalition has not presented any information in that regard to the United Nations, as required by the relevant Security Council resolutions. The annex to the present letter lists the oil installations that American aircraft bombed in the period from 30 October to 15 November 2015 as part of the war that is being waged against Syria.

In that connection, we note that the armed terrorist groups that are stealing Syrian oil and selling it illegally through Turkish channels are not stealing it directly from terminals, but rather at points near the oil wells throughout Syria's oil fields.

Attacks by aircraft of the so-called coalition against the economic facilities and the infrastructure, and the unilateral coercive measures imposed by certain countries against the Syrian people are exacerbating the current difficult conditions in Syria.

In view of the deliberate destruction of the country's oil and economic installations, the Syrian Arab Republic reserves its right under international law to demand compensation from the States members of the American coalition for the damage that they have caused.

I should be grateful if the present letter and its annex could be issued as a document of the seventieth session of the General Assembly, under agenda item 108, and of the Security Council.
