LETTER DATED 3 JANUARY 1990 FROM THE DEPUTY PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Upon instructions from my Government and pursuant to our numerous letters concerning Iraqi violations of the cease-fire, I have the honour to submit a list of further violations of the cease-fire by Iraqi forces. The numerical sequences of these violations follow the sequence of those previously reported.

2293. On 5, 6 and 7 September 1989, Iraqi forces were seen patrolling for three consecutive nights from the geographic co-ordinates of NE 835-658 to the geographic co-ordinates of NE 832-660 on the map of Baneh.

2294. At 1100 hours on 7 September 1989, an Iraqi helicopter was seen flying from the east to the west of Sur Kooh from the geographic co-ordinates of NE 508-842 to the geographic co-ordinates of NE 64-71 on the map of Garmab.

2295. At 1130 hours on 7 September 1989, an Iraqi helicopter was seen flying from the geographic co-ordinates of NE 13-89 to the geographic co-ordinates of NF 10-04 on the map of Galeh Dizeh.

2296. At 1120 hours on 7 September 1989, an Iraqi helicopter was observed flying at the geographic co-ordinates of WF 107-046 on the map of Galeh Dizeh.

2297. At 1150 hours on 7 September 1989, an Iraqi helicopter was seen flying from the geographic co-ordinates of NE 304-785 to the geographic co-ordinates of NE 294-823 on the map of Mayoot.

2298. At 10.7 hours on 7 September 1989, an Iraqi plane was seen flying over the Kani Manka hills towards Panjwain on the map of Marivan.

2299. On 7 September 1989, five Iraqi soldiers occupied two abandoned bunkers at the geographic co-ordinates of ND 682-316 on the map of Qasr-e-Shirin.

- 2300. On 7 September 1989, a concrete bunker was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of QA 46-68 on the map of Yabeis.
- 2301. On 8 September 1989, Iraqi infantrymen constructed bunkers and installed barbed wire at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 280-028 on the map of Sardasht.
- 2302. At 0915 hours on 8 September 1989, ammunition was unloaded from two Iraqi long trucks at the geographic co-ordinates of QA 70-20 on the map of Chazabeh.
- 2303. On 8 September 1989, Iraqi forces constructed an embankment in the form of a stronghold from the geographic co-ordinates of QA 69-21 to the geographic co-ordinates of QA 71-19 on the map of Chazabeh.
- 2304. On 9 September 1989, Iraqi forces constructed a new bunker at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 535-785 on the map of Garmab.
- 2305. On 9 September 1989, two bunkers were constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of QA 122-920 on the map of Nahr-e-Anbar.
- 2306. On 10 September 1989, three Iraqis were seen constructing a bunker and digging a trench at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 907-327 on the map of Panjwain.
- 2307. On 10 September 1989, eight Iraqi infantrymen constructed a bunker and dug a connecting trench at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 897-329 on the map of Panjwain.
- 2308. On 10 September 1989, a bunker was constructed on the Dupaza hills at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 288-028 on the map of Sardasht.
- 2309. On 10 September 1989, an observation post was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NC 562-466 on the map of Sumar.
- 2310. On 10 September 1989, an observation post was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of PB 115-718 on the map of Mehran.
- 2311. On 11 September 1989, eight Iraqi infantrymen dug a trench at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 91-38 on the map of Marivan.
- 2312. On 11 September 1989, Iraqi forces dug a new 20-metre-long connecting trench at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 044-567 on the map of Piranshahr.
- 2313. On 11 September 1989, a bunker was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 628-728 on the map of Garmab.
- 2314. On 12 September 1989, two group bunkers were constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 045-558 on the map of Piranshahr.

- 2315. On 12 September 1989, a connecting trench was dug at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 906-329 on the map of Panjwain.
- 2316. On 12 September 1989, a connecting trench was dug at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 460-832 on the map of Garmab.
- 2317. On 12 September 1989, a bunker was constructed by Iraqi forces at the geographic co-ordinates of QA 322-921 on the map of Nahr-e-Anbar.
- 2318. On 13 September 1989, a new bunker was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 293-957 on the map of Sardasht.
- 2319. On 13 September 1989, two new bunkers were constructed by Iraqi forces at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 29-10 on the map of Sardasht.
- 2320. At 1050 hours on 13 September 1989, a connecting trench was dug by eight Iraqi soldiers at the geographic co-ordinates of NC 511-693 on the map of Sizdeh.
- 2321. On 13 September 1989, Iraqi forces constructed a bunker and a sunshade at the geographic co-ordinates of ND 684-244 on the map of Qasr-e-Shirin.
- 2322. On 14 September 1989, Iraqi forces dug a connecting trench at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 883-330 and NE 883-332 on the map of Panjwain.
- 2323. On 14 September 1989, a bunker was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 280-048 on the map of Sardasht.
- 2324. On 14 September 1989, an observation post was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NC 493-652 on the map of Sizdeh.
- 2325. On 14 September 1989, a radio antenna was installed at the geographic co-ordinates of PB 144-777 on the map of Mehran.
- 2326. At 1150 hours on 15 September 1989, Iraqi infantrymen were constructing a bunker and digging a connecting trench at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 288-048 and NF 282-042 on the map of Sardasht.
- 2327. On 15 September 1989, five Iraqi soldiers dug a connecting trench at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 907-327 on the map of Panjwain.
- 2328. On 15 September 1989, a 20-metre-long connecting trench was dug at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 685-638 on the map of Baneh.
- 2329. On 15 September 1989, a communication tower was installed at the geographic co-ordinates of NC 91-13 on the map of Helaleh.
- 2330. On 15 September 1989, Iraqi forces deployed 130 mm artillery behind the heights at the geographic co-ordinates of PB 058-483 on the map of South Mehran.

- 2331. From 15 to 17 September 1989, four new shelters were constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 283-046 on the map of Sardasht.
- 2332. At 1100 hours on 16 September 1989, three Iraqi helicopters were observed flying at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 887-413 and NE 88-33 on the map of Panjwain.
- 2333. On 16 September 1989, Iraqi forces were seen digging a connecting trench and constructing a bunker at the geographic co-ordinates of NF 2885-2800 and NF 290-007 on the maps of Sardasht and Alayan.
- 2334. On 16 September 1989, a concrete bunker was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 837-658 on the map of Baneh.
- 2335. On 16 September 1989, a bunker was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 859-658 on the map of Baneh.
- 2336. On 16 September 1989, a connecting trench was dug at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 905-325 on the map of Panjwain.
- 2337. At 1150 hours on 16 September 1989, two Iraqi helicopters were seen flying from the geographic co-ordinates of NE 126-884 to the geographic co-ordinates of 105-045 on the map of Galeh Dizeh.
- 2338. On 16 September 1989, a trench was dug by five Iraqi soldiers at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 761-590 on the map of Baneh.
- 2339. At 1210 hours on 16 September 1989, two Iraqi helicopters were seen flying and landing respectively over Shohada hill and Haj Omran on the map of Piranshahr.
- 2340. On 16 September 1989, an observation post was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of QA 275-890 on the map of Nahr-e-Anbar.
- 2341. On 16 September 1989, an observation bunker was constructed at the geographic co-ordinates of QA 228-992 on the map of Dehloran.
- 2342. On 18 September 1989, Iraqi forces constructed a new bunker and installed barbed wire at the geographic co-ordinates of NE 563-793 on the map of Garmab.
