Statement

The sixtieth session of the Commission on the status of Women March 14th to 24th, 2016 should focus primarily on a detailed technological agenda with multidisciplinary strategies (probabilities and statistics) to detect, involve and cure governmental weaknesses in governance.

The future should give more trust to women who showed through the Millennium Development Goals bright results and serious commitment.

Civil society and Non-governmental Organizations should lead projects where women and girls can prosper and reach economic independence in order to come out of poverty and accomplish step-by-step the Sustainable Development Goals 2015-2030.

Today technology offers unlimited possibilities in the service of human beings and will be a principal factor in eradicating poverty.

As a result, a safer world with no hungry people, with education for all, without disease, with clean water and environment, with no conflicts and wars, with no violence against women and gender equality, which is what ALL humans on earth envision.
