ELECTION OF ADDITIONAL MEMBERS OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL OF THE SPECIAL FUND

8. The PRESIDENT invited the Council to elect six additional members of the Governing Council of the Special Fund, in pursuance of General Assembly resolution 1945 (XVIII). In accordance with paragraph 14 of part B of General Assembly resolution 1240 (XIII), there should be equal representation on the Governing Council of economically more developed countries, on the one hand, having due regard to their contributions to the Special Fund, and of less developed countries, on the other hand, taking into account the need for equitable geographical distribution among the latter members. In accordance with previous practice, he proposed that the vote should be taken in two parts, the first to fill the three seats intended for the economically more developed countries, and the second to fill the three seats intended for the less developed countries.
