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Audit reports for the year ended 31 December 1959 relating to expenditure by the International Atomic Energy Agency and specialized agencies of technical assistance funds allocated from the Special Account

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Note by the Secretary-General

1. In accordance with the requirements of General Assembly resolution 519 A (VI) adopted on 12 January 1952, there are submitted herewith the audit reports for the year ended 31 December 1959 relating to expenditures by the specialized agencies of technical assistance funds allocated from the Special Account. Paragraph 7 of the resolution reads as follows:

"Calls on the specialized agencies participating in the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance to provide, in their regular budget documents, information concerning their estimates for the expenditure of technical assistance funds; and to transmit to the General Assembly, for examination and approval, the audit reports relating to expenditure of technical assistance funds allocated from the Special Account after approval of the appropriate audit reports by the general conferences of their agencies or by such other authorities of the agencies as are constitutionally authorized to approve them."

2. Attached to the present document is a combined statement (annex 1) showing the status of funds of all the participating organizations under the Expanded Programme as at 31 December 1959, which summarizes the separate audited financial statements submitted by the specialized agencies, together with similar information regarding the transactions of the United Nations as a participating organization in the Programme and the cost of the Technical Assistance Board secretariat.

3. The audited financial statements of the specialized agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) are attached as annexes 2 to 9; these comprise for each agency the financial statement showing the

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status of its funds, in the form prescribed by the Technical Assistance Board, bearing the certificate of the external auditors, and the relevant audit report submitted to the general conference of the agency concerned.¹ As in previous years, the detailed supporting schedules furnished by the several agencies, to which references are made in the financial statements, are not included in this submission but are made available to the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions.

4. The audit reports of the following agencies for the year 1959 have been approved by their general conference:

(a) The International Labour Organisation (ILO), on 20 June 1960;

(b) The World Health Organization (WHO), on 11 May 1960;

(c) The International Telecommunication Union (ITU), on 2 July 1960.

The audit report for the year 1959 relating to the accounts of the International Atomic Energy Agency was examined by the IAEA Board of Governors on 20 June 1960. The Board recommended adoption by the General

Conference which will convene in September 1960. The audit report of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) for 1959 will be submitted to the FAO Conference in November 1961. The report of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) for 1959 will be submitted for approval at the next session of the UNESCO General Conference which will be held in November/December 1960. The Council of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) approved the audit report on 8 April 1960. It will be presented to the next session of the ICAO Assembly to be held in 1961 or 1962. The audit report of the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) has been submitted for approval to the WMO Executive Committee now in session.

5. The audited financial statements of the United Nations as a participating organization in the Expanded Programme are presented in the financial reports and accounts for the year ended 31 December 1959 (A/4380). Also included in the same document are financial statements in respect of the secretariat of the Technical Assistance Board (TAB), as well as a statement (schedule H) showing the status of the Special Account as at 31 December 1959.

6. A consolidated statement which reflects the financial transactions of the Expanded Programme as a whole is attached as annex 10.

REPORT OF THE EXTERNAL AUDITOR TO THE CONFERENCE OF THE FOOD AND AGRICULTURE ORGAN-IZATION OF THE UNITED NATIONS ON THE ACCOUNT OF THE EXPANDED PROGRAMME OF TECH-NICAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1959

1. Volume II of the accounts of FAO for the year ended 31 December 1959 consists of the statement of account of the technical assistance funds allocated to the Organization, together with the related schedule of project costs. The statement and schedule are in the form prescribed by the Technical Assistance Board.

2. My examination has been carried out in conjunction with my audit of the accounts of the regular programme of the Organization and in accordance with the financial regulations of the Organization and the statement of principles governing audit procedure annexed to those regulations. I have also examined the reports of the Internal Auditor, the effectiveness of whose work during the year has materially facilitated my own examination. In accordance with the arrangements made between the Technical Assistance Board and the Joint Panel of Auditors of the United Nations, a certified copy of the statement and schedule, and a copy of this report, have been sent to the Board. A copy of that part of my report on the accounts of the regular programme for the biennial accounting period 1958-1959 which refers to the allocation of administrative and operational services costs between the regular and technical assistance programmes has also been sent to the Board.

3. In the course of my examination a number of questions have been raised with the Organization and answered satisfactorily. The subjects dealt with below alone appear to call for separate mention in my report.

Allocations from the Expanded Programme Special Account for administrative end operational services costs

4. As indicated in my report on the regular programme accounts for the biennial accounting period 1958/59, the Organization received from Technical Assistance funds a lump-sum allocation of \$1,278,400 towards the administrative and operational services costs incurred on behalf of the Expanded Programme in 1959. This sum, which equalled the amount of the 1958 allocation, was paid to the regular programme as a contribution towards the costs incurred.

Ex gratia payments and losses and writes-off

5. I have examined the circumstances in which the ex gratia payment of \$500 was made during 1959 and the losses and writes-off totalling \$1,751 which are listed in the financial report of the Director-General. I have no comments to make upon them.

6. I wish to record my appreciation of the willing co-operation of the officers of the Organization during my examination.

REPORT OF THE EXTERNAL AUDITOR ON THE STATEMENT SHOWING THE STATUS OF ALLOCATIONS TO THE UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATION AS AT 31 DECEMBER 1959

1. The statement is in the form set out in annex IV, as revised with effect from 1 January 1959, of the Financial Regulations of the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance, edition II.

2. Allocations from contributions and other available funds in 1959 were \$4,695,652 compared with \$4,590,866 in 1958, and the balance reallocated in 1959 was \$876,585 compared with \$1,738,406 in 1958. Income from allocations and reallocations therefore decreased from \$6,329,272 in 1958 to \$5,572,237 in 1959, a reduction of 12 per cent. As the statement shows, the excess of allocations, etc., over obligations was \$732,992, being approximately 13 per cent of the total allocations for the year. Obligations amounting to \$606,724, however, had been cancelled as at 31 December 1959 because goods or services had not been received or rendered by that date.

3. About 24 per cent (\$1,360,884) of the allocations, etc. in 1959 consisted of certain specified currencies for which utilization targets were prescribed by the Technical Assistance Committee. Obligations in the specified currencies recorded during 1959 in respect of projects to which these allocations related amounted to \$1,347,247 of which \$754,426 represented contractual commitments entered into in 1958 or earlier, the funds for which were reallocated in 1959. Obligations amounting to \$509,648 were cancelled owing to the non-delivery of goods by 31 December 1959.

4. The Organization received from Technical Assistance funds a lump-sum allocation of \$505,779 towards the administrative and operational services costs incurred on behalf of the Expanded Programme in 1959. This sum was paid to the regular programme as a contribution towards the costs incurred.

REPORT OF THE EXTERNAL AUDITOR TO THE ASSEMBLY ON THE AUDIT OF THE ACCOUNTS REGARD-ING THE STATUS OF FUNDS OF THE INTERNATIONAL CIVIL AVIATION ORGANIZATION RELATING TO THE EXPANDED PROGRAMME OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE OF THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1959

1. The Technical Assistance Board finance manual requires that "external audit relating to the Expanded Programme shall be reported separately from that of the regular programme activities of the participating organizations", and this is the report on the audit of the accounts for the year ended 31 December 1959.

2. The financial statement showing the status of funds of ICAO relating to the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance as at 31 December 1959 was submitted by the Secretary General for audit examination, along with the supporting schedule for obligations incurred during the year then ended, both in the form required by the Technical Assistance Board financial manual. The financial statement and the related schedule have been examined, and certified as being in accordance with the accounts maintained by the Organization and, in my opinion, correct.

3. The audit was performed in the same manner as in previous years, the various classes of transactions being test-checked to the extent considered necessary to establish the correctness of the accounts and the fairness of the financial statement and supporting schedule.

4. Allocations by the Technical Assistance Board from contributions and other available funds in 1959 were \$1,337,600. This, together with an adjusted 1958 balance of \$64,511 reallocated in 1959, gave a total of \$1,402,111 available for obligation during the year under review, as shown in the financial statement.

5. The obligations incurred during the years ended 31 December 1959 amounted to \$1,334,090. The following is an analysis of the amount, compared with corresponding figures for the two previous years:

6. It was ascertained in the course of the audit that all the obligations charged in the year were in conformity with the following definition in the Technical Assistance Board finance manual:

"'Obligations' represent contracts or purchase orders which resulted or will result in a legal liability for payment of services rendered or goods received by 31 December of the current financial year and, in respect of fellowships, the full cost of completion of fellowships awarded before 31 December of the financial year; provided that the fellow has been nominated by the requesting Government and accepted by the organization concerned and that a formal letter of award has been issued to the requesting Government, the actual placement of the fellow prior to 31 December in this sense not to be an essential consideration."

Of the obligations incurred in 1959, a total of \$140,321 remained unliquidated at the close of the year, of which \$43,200 was with respect to fellowships.

7. The statement of supplies and equipment ordered but not delivered as at 31 December 1959, and totalling \$13,334, prepared for submission to the Technical Assistance Board in accordance with article 14.1 of the finance manual, was verified in the course of the audit.

All information and explanations required were readily provided, and the audit was facilitated by the co-operation extended by officers of the Secretariat.
