**Report of the Jabal Marrah Region Support Commission**

19 June 2016

**Report on the voluntary return of persons affected by the events in the Jabal Marrah region**

**Introduction**

Efforts by the Government and its partners to provide food and shelter to affected persons have helped to stabilize the humanitarian situation in the Jabal Marrah region. Voluntary return operations implemented in parts of Central Darfur State and North Darfur State have involved some 25,000 individuals.

**Measures taken by the Federal Government**

1. The Jabal Marrah Region Support Commission, chaired by the Vice-President of the Republic, held four meetings.
2. The technical committee to provide support to the Jabal Marrah area, chaired by the Minister of State for the Ministry of Health, held 10 meetings, in addition to separate meetings with partners, including the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the World Food Programme (WFP), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the World Health Organization (WHO).
3. The Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning approved the allocation of 10 million Sudanese pounds for voluntary return operations and the normalization of the humanitarian situation in the Jabal Marrah area as follows: 5 million pounds for the Humanitarian Aid Commission, 3 million pounds for the national water and environmental remediation initiative and 2 million pounds for the federal Ministry of Health.
4. The Humanitarian Aid Commission sent an advance mission headed by the Director of Disaster Risk Reduction and Humanitarian Assistance to make logistical arrangements and monitor aid in the region. That mission is continuing its work.

**Measures taken by the State Governments**

1. Starting on 7 June 2016, the Council of Ministers of the Central Darfur State government, headed by the State Governor, spent 10 days in the Golo region to inspect conditions and address problems.

2. Approximately 4,600,000 Sudanese pounds were provided for the transport of returnees, and 672,720 Sudanese pounds were provided for the purchase of foodstuffs and shelter supplies.
3. Popular committees were formed to coordinate voluntary return operations with displaced persons.
4. The State Commission has been in contact with international and local organizations about providing assistance.

#### Figures on voluntary return

Some 82 voluntary return operations have been conducted. Some 25,460 individuals have returned to their villages of origin, including 17,900 individuals from camps in Central Darfur State and 7,879 individuals from camps in Northern Darfur State. That number does not include persons who returned via animal transport or on foot.

- WFP was authorized to provide 1.878 tons of foodstuffs (for 69,535 individuals) in the Tur, Nertiti, Golo and Guldo regions, including wheat, lentils and children's biscuits, for three months. They will be distributed through the Sudanese Red Crescent Society.

- WFP was authorized to provide to provide 1.355 tons of foodstuffs (for 75,323 individuals) in the Fanga and Rokero areas north of Jabal Marrah, including wheat, lentils and children's biscuits, for two months. They will be distributed through the Sudanese Red Crescent Society.
