

CONSTITUTION OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON INFORMATION
TRANSMITTED UNDER ARTICLE 73 e OF THE CHARTER

REPORT OF THE FOURTH COMMITTEE

The General Assembly, at its hundred and seventh **plenary meeting** held on 3 November 1947, adopted a resolution concerning the creation of a special committee on information transmitted under Article 73 e of the Charter. By letter of 4 November, the President of the General Assembly informed the Chairman of the Fourth Committee that the Committee would be required to meet in order (1) to constitute the special committee; and (2) to make a recommendation to the General Assembly concerning the time of meeting of the special committee.

The Fourth Committee accordingly reconvened on 6 November 1947.

In the first place, it elected the following Members to appoint representatives to the Special Committee in addition to the representatives to be appointed by the eight Members which have undertaken to transmit information under Article 73 e of the Charter: China, Colombia, Cuba, Egypt, India, Nicaragua, Sweden and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

The Committee will therefore be composed of the above eight Members and the following Members transmitting information: Australia, Belgium, Denmark, France, Netherlands, New Zealand, United Kingdom and United States of America.

The General Assembly is hereby informed of these elections.

The resolution of the General Assembly concluded with a provision that the Special Committee would meet as the General Assembly may decide. In regard to this point, the Fourth Committee recommends that the special committee shall be convened at a date to be fixed by the Secretary-General, this date to be not less than two weeks before the opening of the next regular session of the General Assembly.
