SUPPLEMENTARY ESTIMATES FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1955

Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Mauro MENDEZ (Philippines)

- 1. In accordance with the decision of the General Assembly at its 530th plenary meeting, held on 30 September 1955 regarding the allocation of agenda items, the Fifth Committee at its 527th meeting considered the item "Supplementary estimates for the financial year 1955".
- 2. The Committee agreed that the original 1955 budget appropriations of \$46,963,800 which the General Assembly had approved on 17 December 1954 by resolution 890 (IX), should be increased by a supplementary appropriation of \$3,264,200, as requested by the Secretary-General.
- 3. The additional appropriation comprises:
 - (a) \$1,400,000 for 1955 expenditures arising from the International Conference on the Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy, held in Geneva in August 1955 pursuant to General Assembly resolution 810 (IX) of 4 December 1954;
 - (b) \$1,630,000 to cover the reimbursement of national income taxes levied in respect of salaries and other encluments paid by the United Nations to its staff members in 1955;
 - (c) \$370,000, approximately, to cover sundry other expenditures incurred by the Secretary-General under resolution 891 (IX) relating to unforeseen and extraordinary expenses, less a saving of approximately \$135,800 on the original appropriation, as indicated in the relevant reports (A/C.5/629,650) of the Secretary-General.

- At its 512th meeting the Fifth Committee had previously undertaken a review of the estimates in connexion with item 3 (a) above on the basis of a report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/638) and the comments (A/3029), thereon of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Eudgetary Questions. As a result of this review, the Fifth Committee had decided, without objection, to approve the recommendations of the Advisory Committee for appropriations of (1) \$1,400,000 in a separate new section of the 1955 budget; and (2) \$961,000 in a separate new section of the 1956 budget to meet the expenditures connected with the Conference. These combined appropriations were \$100,000 below the estimates presented by the Secretary-General. In this connexion, the Committee approved the suggestions of the Advisory Committee that to the extent that it was needed, an amount of \$50,000 in respect of translation and printing of the records of the Conference should be met out of the normal 1956 appropriations for publications and that proposed expenditures for public information activities in connexion with the Conference and its proceedings should be met to the extent of \$50,000 out of the over-all allocation of funds for the department concerned in the 1956 budget estimates.
- 5. A number of delegations commented upon the success achieved by the Conference and on the effective arrangements which the Secretary-General had made for it. The hope was expressed that the experience thus gained would enable the Secretary-General, the Advisory Committee and Governments to obtain even better results in the future while keeping expenditure to the minimum, and the view was held that it would be desirable, in future undertakings of a similar nature, for the Advisory Committee and the General Assembly to give, to the fullest extent possible, prior close study to the level of the relevant budget estimates.
- 6. In connexion with item 3 (b) above, the Fifth Committee, at its 521st meeting, following consideration of item 48 of the agenda, "Use of income derived from the Staff Assessment Plan", had decided to recommend the inclusion in the supplementary estimates for 1955, of the sum of \$1,630,000 to cover the reimbursement of national income taxes levied in respect of salaries and other emoluments paid by the United Nations to staff members in 1955.

- 7. In recommending approval of the supplementary appropriations requested by the Secretary-General, the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, in its thirtieth report (A/3068) to the tenth session suggested (paragraph 5) that the annual budget submission should in future include information, in as precise a form as possible, on the anticipated amounts of supplementary requests for the current year, so that Member States might be enabled to make a preliminary estimate of the probable total amount to be assessed in respect of the year to which the budget submission related. For the same reason, advance information might also be given concerning supplementary items for that year which could be foreseen though with insufficient precision for inclusion in the budget. The Committee recognized that at the date of preparation of the annual estimates such information would necessarily be of a tentative character.
- 8. As a result of its discussion, the Fifth Committee, by 34 votes to 4, decided to recommend to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Resolves that for the financial year 1955:

1. The amount of \$46,963,800 appropriated by resolution 890 (IX), adopted on 17 December 1954, is increased by \$3,264,200 as follows:
