Addendum

1. By note dated 28 September 1961, the Permanent Mission of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia to the United Nations informed the Secretariat that the Yugoslav Government had granted a scholarship for study in Yugoslavia to a student from Tanganyika, to be utilized in the forthcoming academic year in October.

By letter dated 9 October 1961, the Permanent Mission of the Union of Soviet

academic year 1960-1961, 2,626 under-graduate and graduate students from countries in Asia, Africa and Latin America were studying in the Soviet Union, including 529 at the Patrice Lumumba People's Friendship University. Two students - from Ruanda-Urundi and Tanganyika - were among them. The Secretariat was also informed that for the academic year 1961-1962 it was the intention to admit to Soviet higher educational institutions sixteen inhabitants from Trust Territories.
